1) GK'S REPORT

- a) Mardi Gras 2011 by Catholic Charities of Orange County, honoring the Knights of Columbus, will be on March 5, at 6:00 p.m. at the South Coast Westin. Tickets are \$150 per person.
- b) The State and Supreme have college scholarships available for Children of Knights of Columbus.
- c) Day of sharing is April 16.
- d) May 12 – May 15 is the San Diego State Convention for the Knights.

2) TREASURER'S AND FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORTS

- a) Checking account: \$15,974.77; Savings: \$3,310.47; Vanguard account: \$34,596.48 for a total of \$53,881.54. Receipts of the meeting were \$6,305.57.

3) APPLICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

- a) Two applications for membership, David Belz and Christopher Poli, were approved.

4) COMMITTEE REPORTS

- a) John Ojeda reported that the final total of the ID Drive will in excess of \$38,000.
- b) Tom Haas reported on the Parish Mission, starting on March 14, at 8:00 a.m. Father Bob Weiss is arriving together with another priest on March 12, and will give homilies on March 13. Help will be needed to obtain sleeping quarters for the priests or they will need to be put up in a hotel.
- c) Ken Allen reported on Knights' scholarships. Students will need to write a letter concerning his or her feelings on their Catholic education. The letter from the parent accepting the scholarship will need to be included. Those need to be in by the first week of May. Ushers will need help for Ash Wednesday.
- d) The deadline for newsletter submissions is the 25th of the month.
- e) Roger reported that the blood drive garnered 42 pints.
- f) Jerry Dubois reported that recycling in January earned \$2,190, for a total of over \$302,000 so far. The recyclers will need help on Mondays and Tuesdays.

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Jerry Gau Memorial Scholarship Program

My brother Knights as we enter the second half of the 2010/2011 Columbian year I would like to review and remind regarding the council's Jerry Gau Memorial Scholarship program.

The eligibility period is the traditional school year for pre-school through high school (Sept-June). The assistance is rendered at the completion of the year not in preparation. For students enrolled in Catholic colleges or universities the requirement is the completion of a minimum of one full

semester during the same time frame.

Student's need to submit a brief statement to the council relating their experience and thoughts regarding a Catholic education. The Knight parent is required to send a letter acknowledging and agreeing to accept scholarship assistance from the council.

These letters need to be received by the scholarship chairman, Grand Knight or Deputy GK no later than the 10th of May so that they may be presented to the council officers for approval at

the May officers meeting.

These letters may be mailed, e-mailed or delivered in person.

The checks will be made out to the Knight parent and issued at the June general meeting. Reminders will be included in future bulletins.
