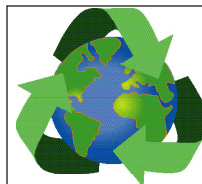

We had a good response from our Council members plus a good share of teens working for service hours.

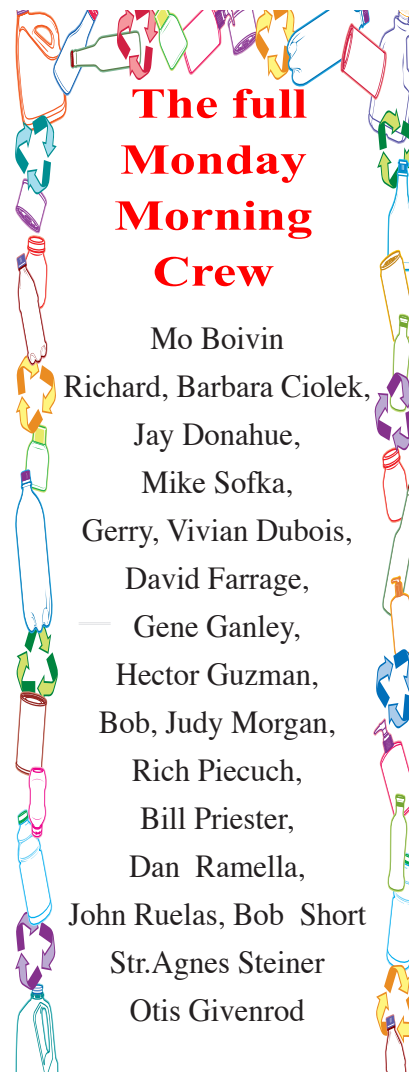
