<u>The Chaplain's Message</u> **Don't forget the true** meaning of Christmas

December brings us Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year. On Dec. 8, we celebrate the

Immaculate Conception of Mary, which is the patronal feast of the United States. We should reflect on the purity and holiness of the Blessed Virgin Mary and see her as a model for all Christians.

Two days later, we celebrate the feast of our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Diocese of Orange, which marks the first apparition of the Virgin Mary in the Americas. Then of course, we roll into Christmas, where we celebrate the greatest gift ever made to mankind, the coming of our Lord, Jesus Christ; the only begotten son of God sent to free us from sin and to grant eternal life to all who believe in him.

I hope you will all keep in mind the real "reason for the season" and not get too wrapped up in over-spending and political correctness. If we look around carefully at the decorations and listen closely to the carols, we will see the meaning of Christmas is there.
