Notice of intent for motion regarding scholarship issue

At the May 7 Council business meeting there will be a motion brought to the floor to raise the budgeted amount for scholarships for the current Columbian Year from \$3,000 to \$5,000.

The Council has a budgeted amount of \$3,000 earmarked for Catholic School scholarships for our membership who qualify. This budgeted amount has not changed for several years and has not kept pace with our increase in membership. Therefore the amount per student has steadily declined. Last year the individual amount awarded was less than \$250.

The officers have already recommended the \$585 profit from the Family Night Ice Cream Social be directed to this fund. This combined with increased income from recycling and dues will easily cover the requested addition of \$2,000 for scholarships.

This motion will be brought to the floor under new business and if anyone desires to comment, please do so when the Grand Knight calls for discussion. - John Piccolo, GK
