Council adopts descretionary spending limit

We all had hoped that our economy would have turned around by now. But the facts are that we are still struggling with major unemployment, inflation and a housing market still not recovered.

As a Council, most of our revenues have and are continuing to decline.

The price we receive for our recycling efforts continues to drop, we have financially helped some of our Brothers, and we have forgiven dues for a number of our unemployed brethern.

As a consequence of these tough times, the officers have voted on a new procedure for our council. Since the councils' inception, our by-laws contained a provision that we were able to

While our council is not in financial trouble, the officers decided that a more stringent limit be placed on the discretionary spending at this time.

We now will require a member vote on any non-budgeted expense exceeding \$100. At a future date, this matter will be examined and if the economy begins and sustains a recovery, the officers will consider a future amendment to this change. God bless.

Insurance Report Knights with KofC annunities entitled to new benefit known as Medical Withdraw Option

Owners of Knights of Columbus annuities are now the recipients of a fraternal benefit called the Medical Withdrawal Option (MWO).

The MWO (provided at no cost by the way) allows the annuitant to withdraw all or part of the Accumulation Value of the annuity with no surrender charge, provided that:

1) The annuitant has a medical condition that is expected to result in death within twelve months, or

2) The annuitant undergoes a major organ transplant, suffers major burns, or is diagnosed as having life-threatening cancer, heart



attack, unstable angina, stroke, end-stage kidney disease, paralysis or coma, or 3) The annuitant is confined in a licensed skilled nursing facility for at least 60) consecutive days.

The MWO is available once the accumulation value of the annuity is \$5,000 or more, and became available Feb. 1, 2006, for existing and newly issued annuities.

To be eligible, the annuitant must have a qualifying medical condition that commenced after 2-1-06 or the date you started your annuity, whichever is later.

Please note that any waiver of Knights of Columbus surrender charges will have no affect on any tax reporting, tax withholding or tax penalty that may be imposed by the U.S. or Canadian governments.

There are a number of additional restrictions and conditions that apply to the MWO.

I'll be happy to visit with you and your wife to fully explain this and the Order's entire portfolio of fraternal benefits.

Virtually all Knights of Columbus annuities are covered under the MWO, and as a reminder, surrender charges are also waived in the event of the death of the annuitant.
