tinuing economic problems facing everyone.

One suggestion is to keep the idea of recycling in the minds of parishioners. To do this, we will have an insert printed in the weekly church bulletin with the dates of recycling for the entire year printed, along with a list of the items we recycle. That way, we hope people will put the flyer on their refrigerators as reminders of the program and what items we need to recycle.

Another suggestion is to sell doughnuts and coffee each week, rain or shine. We may be able to use the parish hall in inclement weather.

The Council usually makes \$60 or more every. It would take two or three Brothers to volunteer one week a month to provide doughnuts and coffee. By having it each week, the Council hopes to encourage parishioners to socialize more and foster a sense of camaraderie. Also, it may encourage other Ministries to help and volunteer their assistance for a "cut of the pie."
