The State Convention was held on May 20 – 22 in San Jose. Our Council was represented by myself, PGK Dick Petrash, DGK Bernie Laituri and PGK John Ruelas. There were 550 delegates in attendance, representing all the Councils, Districts and



Chapters in the state. There were several hundred other Brother Knights. The opening Mass featured the sound of cow bells throughout the ceremony. Actually, it was the clanging of glasses on an unstable dais that made that sound.

The State Chief Squire, Brendan Quinn, gave a wonderful speech. It was very encouraging to hear someone younger than 18 years old speak so eloquently. Perhaps all may not be lost with today's youth.

Our Council won first place in the MR Drive – again. This seems to be an annual event. We contributed over \$37,000 and the second place Council donated just over \$17,000.
