Youth free-throw contest set for Jan. 9 in lower level lot

Attention parents and grandparents of future NBA and WNBA stars: The Knights of Columbus basketball free throw contest is a tradition that goes back many decades.

Our Council's contest will be held Jan. 9, from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on the parish grounds in the lower-level lot. The rain date is Jan. 16. The contest is open to all boys and girls ages 10-14 (inclusive) as of Jan. 1, 2011.

The rules are a bit different this year. Boys and girls 10 and 11 will use a women's regulation ball and shoot from 12 feet. Girls 12, 13, and 14 will use a women's regulation ball and shoot from the regulation 15-foot foul line. Boys 12, 13, and 14 will use a men's
