Grand Knight's Report A second look at our charitable giving

Brothers: Rrecently our Council's officers began a discussion regarding our annual charitable giving, analyzing who we give to, how much and how often. As a follow-up to that discussion, and in order to prompt further deliberation, I completed an analysis of our Council's actual charitable giving last year (2010-2011) compared to our proposed

giving this year (2011-2012), and while we have not had the chance yet to verify every figure, this analysis is rather enlightening and thought-provoking.

Essentially, I looked at those expense categories that were charitable in nature, and only included those as part of our normal charitable monthly donations from our operating revenues. In 2010-2011, we donated approximately 27 percent of our Total Operating Income last year, and are projected to donate about 29 percent this year. Annual Roosters food drive set for Dec. 18 this year

Drive (which is a complete pass through, ie. 100 percent raised is given to Columbian Charities), we donated/will donate 53 and 54 percent, respectively.

Lastly, I separately looked at our donations from Reserves (our Vanguard account savings). Last year, it totaled 13 percent (the donation we made to fund the Mission Renewal). This year, we don't have a donation from our Reserves planned.

We all recognize that we don't exist solely as a "pass-through" charitable organization; our core principles (charity, unity, fraternity, patriotism) define the areas that guide our activities, and how and where we should spend our time and money. If you used our four core principles as a guide and allocated a 25 percent share to each, you could conclude that we are meeting our charitable givings goal, as a percent of our Total Operating Income (if you include the ID Drive, then we are certainly passed that).

I believe, however, that we can transcend our charitable donationsto include the other three categories. So much of what we give can also be considered acts of fraternity, patriotism and unity (ie. our gifts to and work with the parish festival, our parish gifts to youth, RSVP, scholarships and PSA, just to name a few) and possibly increase our annual givings to 30-35 percent of Total Operating Income.

In other words, increase our donations in ways that support the other three principles guiding our Council.

This does not mean that this additional giving will come solely from reserves. It could come from a combination of any potential positive earnings that accrue over the year (ie. if we generate

revenue in excess of operating expenses) along with a minor (3-5 percent) portion from our reserves.

The intent of this analysis is to facilitate and continue the discussion among all members that was started at the last officer's meeting. It's not my intent to automatically trigger donations to any one single charity, but rather use some charities we have recently discussed, and this analysis, as a guide to the type of areas we might want to increase our giving in, and how much we can afford to donate.

We will continue this discussion at the officer level over the coming months and encourage your input as we consider what we give, where we give and how much we give. Feel free to email me about it at steveeggert@cox. net
