Grand Knight's Report Lean economy calls for raise in dues by \$5

At our last month's Officer's meeting, a drop in forecasted revenues for the year was discussed.

Due in large part to a decline in anticipated profits from our Entertainment Book sales (dis-

cussed below) as well as a decline in membership dues payments, we find ourselves in need of additional revenues in order to maintain our level of operations and givings (charitable



donations) that we have planned for this year and beyond.

While the yeoman efforts of Brother Rich Piecuch and his assistant, Brother Ricardo Teano, have resulted in stellar results in the past, the uphill battle these two have fought against the onerous terms of the Entertainment Book company (ie. selling through alternative retailers as well as online at prices that significantly undercut what we can charge and still make a profit, etc.) have placed our Council in a position where we find that we will not be able to rely upon this source of revenue this year.

And going forward, as we have

in past. Additionally, despite the efforts of our Financial Secretary John Ojeda, as well as retention efforts headed up by Brother Ricardo, we find ourselves again collecting less in membership dues from all brothers (we are currently collecting about 77 percent from all members, despite the fact that we must pay to Supreme per capita dues for every member in our Council).

Thus, in order to offset the loss to revenues discussed above, the Officers have proposed that we increase per member dues \$5 for this Columbian Year.

This increase will help our Council maintain operations as well as our charitable givings as budgeted. It is proposed that member dues increase from \$40 to \$45 per member, with the voluntary \$3.65 (for the state-wide 365 Club fund to assist Brothers in financial distress) added to that.

It has been over two years since dues were last raised in our Council.

We remain at or below the level of dues charged by many Councils and be assured that we strive to manage Council expenses at the most efficient level possible to ensure that such increases proposed above are infrequent and held to a minimum.

Since this is a non-budgeted item, this proposed increase does need to be voted on by the membership at our Feb. 1 business meeting.

Thank you all and I pray that this newsletter finds all of you and your families well in this New Year.
