Thanks to all for another great recycling month, plus all those folks below, not to mention our great Monday and Tuesday crew.

For December we made \$2,827 the second highest earning month for the year and a great way to end 2011.

That raised our total earnings to \$329,515. The dedication that we had was great. This ensures us a very successful program.

We look forward to seeing all of you Saturday, Feb. 11.

Here are the individual pounds collected in each category and total pounds for the year:

Paper, 323,259; plastic, 8,978; aluminum, 2,302; glass, 30,295; and cardboard, 13,344. The total is 378,178, which equates to 189 ton of recyclables for the year.

At our last recycling, Tiffany Hamilton and her mother brought pizzas for all of us to enjoy, and to thank us for our help in her effort to collect tabs for the Ronald McDonald House. She also handed each of us a thank you note for our help. She is no longer collecting and we will miss her.
