The Recruitment Weekend conducted Oct. 6-7 was one of the most productive ever held by our Council. Twenty-four prospects were recruited after the Masses and five completed the Form 100 Application for membership on the spot.

At the beginning of the mass, letters of introduction were distributed to male parishioners as they entered church. The letter summarized the ideals of our order and advertised the extensive participation of our council in most of our church's ministries.

Able speakers did the pulpit announcements of the recruitment drive during the masses for the entire congregation.

After Mass, volunteer Knights answered ques-
