He supports Fr. Bill's parish project in Tijuana so much that Jay would like to start extending this spirit of charity to everyone.

salary. The monies we take in after expenses we put out to charitable organizations and to our church.

Yes, it does take money to run our Council but the bulk of these funds come from the recycle program and dues.

We are lucky in that we do not have to come up with events on a weekly basis to try and support our voluntary donations.

Most of the other dinners or events such as coffee and doughnuts are designed to gather parishioners together.

This last Lenten season we provided the seed money and some of the manpower and let other ministries earn some of the proceeds.

We give \$6,000 a year to our church. We donate to worthwhile charities monthly besides bringing in over \$35,000 the last 15-plus years to help the Intellectually Disabled.

Knights are Eucharistic Ministers, Lectures, Youth Directors, basically involved on just about every Ministry at Santiago.

- We wheel over residents of Lake Forest Nursing to attend Mass on Sundays.

- We provide overnight vigil to the Blessed Sacrament every First Friday.

- We visit our sick Brothers and family members.

- We escort the Bishop to Confirmation ceremonies.

How can you participate when your time is so precious, and how do we get more attendance at Knight events is really the same situation.

We have over 365 members in Council yet we only seem to get 100 people at a Knights event.

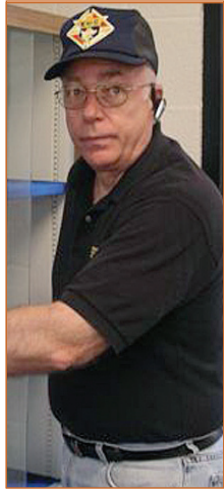
