## An Intent to Motion

Background: At our March 2013 officers meeting, Chapter President Steve Bolton asked Council 9487 to accept the responsibility of feeding the contestants and volunteers at the Special Olympic Spring Games held at Rancho Santa Margarita High School. It was presented to the Council at the April business meeting.

We never published and voted to fund this non-budgeted item as we intended to only expense \$700. Those funds were covered by a Charity box donation, \$100 from our Worthy District Deputy and \$500 authorized by your Officers. The cost turned out to be \$1,466.13.

We now need to reimburse the chapter president for these expenses. This will be an annual event and will be included in our future budget.

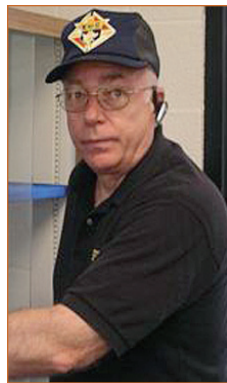
# Additional help is needed from Brothers each month
