Let's also remember our own health and well being and to pray to those that have passed on. We've

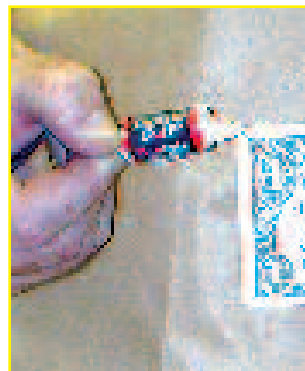

PLEASE READ: RECYCLING NEEDS YOUR HELP

The Monday/Tuesday crew wants to express our sincere thanks to all our members for funding the new recycle facility. It has made our lives so much easier. However, some problems have developed which we believe you may be able to help reduce.

We have observed on at least two occasions an individual in an old beat up pickup truck stopped outside of our drop off area. Because the gate to this area cannot be locked any material left in it is subject to theft.

How can you help?

First, the new drop off area was never intended to substitute for bringing material to the monthly program on the second Saturday of each month. We believe that this is happening however because the volume of material dropped off has more than doubled since we opened the new facility, but the volume collected on Saturdays has not changed to

any significant degree.

This has caused two problems:

1. The material, primarily aluminum and plastic left in the drop off area is vulnerable to being stolen.

We do our best to keep this area picked tip, but can't monitor it 24/7.

2. Even though we have much more room to operate, we do not have unlimited storage in the new facility.

We are asking you to do three things:

1. If you are dropping off items you can hold onto until the second Saturday, please stop. Needless to say we do not want to lose any products to the trash bin, but help us if you can by storing it at home. **If it is necessary that you drop off items please put your aluminum and plastic in a secure plastic bag and throw over the fence into the locked area.** Paper and glass can be left in the regular drop off area.
