A sense of community is the motivation that drives the Eisenbrey family to their acts of charity. After helping with the Christmas decorations at church Dave said "its not work, it's fun."

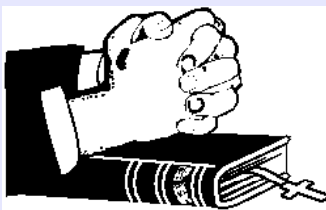
Dave and Joyce also share in the parish community as regulars at Backyard BBQ and Theology as well as being participants in "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner" for many years.

It's uplifting that the Living Faith Booklet is popular in our parish with 550 copies circulated every quarter. The dedication of our Council made it possible. This booklet is a daily devotional reading based on the Scripture passage of the Mass on that day.

It's easy to read one page reflection to start the day, or any time of the day. With readings at the bottom of the page, the booklet helps Catholics pray and meditate with the seasons of the church year in spirit.

The booklet is published in January, April, July and October.

The Knights, through the able leadership of Brother George Nothhelfer, order the 550 copies early each month, ready to be offered to parishioners by the Knights in front of the church before all the Masses.

The suggested donation of \$1 apiece is to keep the community service going.

We've heard people say "I love this book, it's good reading ... I have a subscription but stopped it because the Knights offer it." Some long time readers are generous, giving \$5, \$10 or \$20 for a copy. Others get several copies to share or give as gifts.

A record donation of \$40 was given for one book and the service. Some who forgot their wallets get it free.

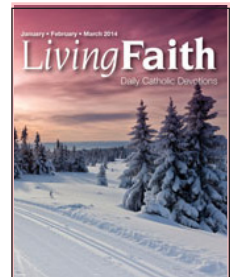

I read this news in our local newspaper in the community section about our member Knight Philip Tagatac.

I knew I had to spread this good news. Philip, 18, is a member of our Council 9487.

He completed his Third degree at our very successful ceremony we sponsored in our parish hall in December. The Boy Scout Troop 604 of Lake Forest will be honoring Philip Tagatac, for his achievement of earning the rank of Eagle.

Sponsored by Santiago de Compostela, Troop 604 has produced one of the highest rates of Eagle Scouts in its history.

Lake Forest resident Tagatac is a first year student at the University of California, Irvine. He earned his Eagle Award in August 2013.

For his Eagle Scout project, Philip supplied a

local school, Abiding Savior, with disaster supplies to support the local community surrounding the facility.

He supplied the school with non-perishable food, 400 gallons of water, flashlights, batteries, first aid kits, and emergency blankets. His project reflected the Scout Motto, "Be Prepared," and now, in the event of an emergency, the school has enough supplies to sustain 200 people for several days.

With the gracious help from Santiago de Compostela, friends, family, and local business Brizio's Pizza, Philip was able to raise over \$4,000 to fund his project.

I heard Philip doing a pulpit announcement asking for donations for this project. The remaining funds were donated back to Abiding Savior in Lake Forest.

Congratulations Philip for being a Knight, a scout, a student, and a role model.

For December, we made \$1,674, raising all-time, total earnings to \$378,224. The dedication that we have is great, which ensures us a very successful program. We look forward to seeing all of you Saturday, Feb. 8.

I hope all of you had a Blessed Christmas.

Our recycling program is successful because of all of you and the effort you put forth. I thank whole heartedly all of my Brothers for the great job in stepping up on Saturday. We had a pretty good day and Gene Ganley stopped by to see how all was going.



We had a lot of teenagers to help out and that was great. Our collection was lower than normal, however that worked in our favor with the amounts that we can turn in that is California CRV. For your information, St. Kilian's shut their program down until they receive certification.

The new facility we built is paying for itself. It is allowing us to hold back on the CRV product so we do not exceed our maximum weights.

If anyone has any leads on businesses to include architectural companies that have excess catalogs that are willing to donate their paper recyclables, please let me know.

Family Matters

Tools designed to make you a better husband

Brothers, we have all heard the admonition by St. Paul to our wives in chapter 5 of Ephesians verse 22: "Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord." This article is not about that. I encourage you to keep reading down to verses 25-33.

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So (also) husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. "For this reason a man shall leave (his) father and (his) mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church. In any case, each one of you should love his wife as himself, and the wife should respect her husband." – Eph 5:25-33

It is a warning to us husbands to love our wives as Christ loved the Church so much that he was willing to die for her.

Are you ready to lay down your life for your wife and family? It's a question I wrestle with. I have never been in the situation where I've had the opportunity to offer my life to a criminal or terrorist to save my wife's life and I suspect I never will.

But every day I have the opportunity to make a little sacrifice for my wife. I can dump the trash without being asked, take her car to the gas station or repair shop, or run an errand for her. None are "big" tasks, but many little things together will make her life easier. Each little task will show that I love her. Words are easy. Doing is hard. Am I willing to sacrifice my TV time or my sleep for her? Sometimes yes, many times no.

But I read Ephesians chapter 5 and realize that after 28 years of marriage I still have plenty of room for improvement. I suspect that you may have some room for improvement as well. You are not alone.

I have some ideas how to gain tools to be a better husband:

- Attend the movie Fireproof with your wife Feb. 22 at Santiago de Compostela. Get a baby sitter and make it a date night.
- Attend a Worldwide Marriage Encounter weekend with your wife. It's not for "bad" marriages but one for making "good" marriages great. (If you are have difficulties in your marriage you may want to consider a Retrouvaille weekend: see me.)
- Go to www.OneStrongFamily.com and get a FAMILY wrist band for a reminder of your wedding vows. FAMILY means, "Forget About Me, I Love You." FAMILY is my personal goal. Some days are easier than others but it is a constant struggle to put my wife and family ahead of my own wants and needs. Vivat Jesus.

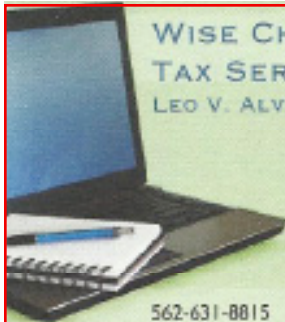

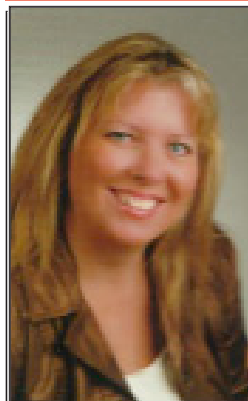
