Family Matters Be a good father, love your kids, spend time with them

Why is it that mothering a child requires a lifetime of loving, nurturing, and caring but fathering a child only requires a single act at a single moment in time? That seems very wrong to me.

I believe that none of the intent to father a child is so that we can neglect or ignore them. I hope you share that belief with me.



When I was young my Mom could strike fear into my heart with the words, "Wait until your Father gets home!" Of course I deserved just punishment and the wait for my dad was often worse than punishment itself.

Like my father, I go to work every day to earn money for the family. I judge that making money to feed, clothe, and house my family is the way that I show that I love them. I provide so that my

wife and son can have their worlly needs taken care of. I fathered a child, and my wife Ann, mothers our child.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Lent and All Souls always causes me to reflect on my own mortality and that of others. None of us are going to get out of this world alive though our souls never die.

My parents have told me that I will have a share in the inheritance that they will someday leave behind. I do not want that inheritance since receiving it means that I have lost my parents. It is not a fair trade.

My parents and I are separated by the width of a continent; they live in Massachusetts, and I don't get to see them nearly as often as I would like anymore.

When I was a child, dad worked a full-time job. On weekends and evenings we got to go fishing and play catch. But no matter how much we did together it was never enough.

I am my father's son and I suspect that my son, George, may say the same of me.

Returning to thoughts of death I realize that some day my Dad will depart me and that I will depart my son. Will he know that I loved him? Do your parents and children know that you love them?

The point of all of this is to encourage you to be a dad for your children, to encourage you to spend time with them while you can.

If you would like a resource, get the book "Christian Fatherhood: The Eight Commitments of St. Joseph's Covenant Keepers" by Steven Wood.

That book was an answer to one of my prayers. Beyond that I would like you to spend some time with your children.

Take your daughter out for a dinner in a nice restaurant, just you and her. Take your son fishing. Or do the reverse, but choose an activity that will allow you to talk and get to know each other. Let them know that you love them.

Do it while still can, forever will be a very long time.
