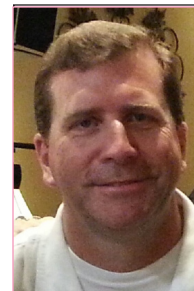
Grand Knight's Report

If any of you Brothers may know of any job vacancy or if you are an employer who is planning to do some hiring, please alert us.

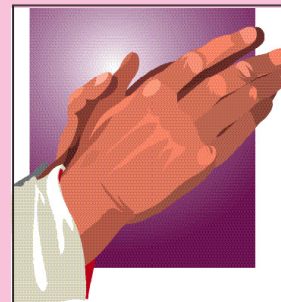

a) Knights can march with Santiago de Compostela in the July 4 Lake Forest parade, see Mike Sofka.

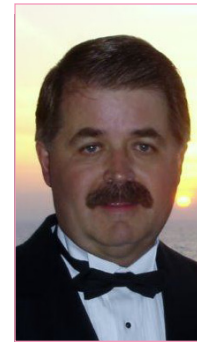
Family Matters

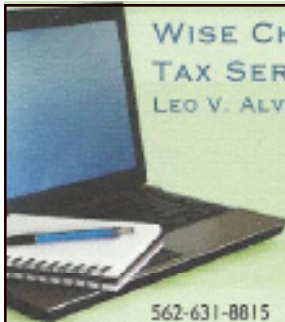
