We were short of Knights last month and need more of a commitment from other Knights. This program is our major fund raiser for our council. We need all of you to participate whether for an hour or more.

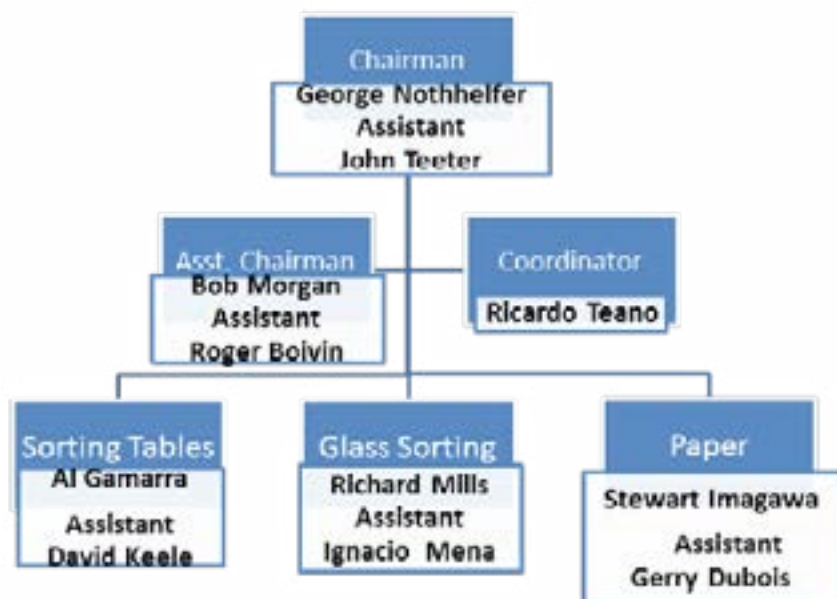
It is my goal to double our volume. This is how we will proceed. I am asking several of you to step forth as supervisors for the four areas listed below:

Scheduled Ceremonials

First Degree

Tuesday, Sept. 30, Santiago De Compostela. GK Michael Lynch. Candidates 7 p.m., Degree ,7:30.

Candidates and observers will dress in a manner fitting the dignity of Formal Knights of Columbus ceremonials. Collared shirts, dress slacks, socks and shoes are the minimum standard. Shorts, tee shirts, sandals, jeans and similarly casual attire are considered inappropriate. A jacket and tie are the desired standard for Third Degree Exemplifications.

First degree candidates should arrive with a Council Representative, preferably the Financial Secretary, who has his signed form 100 which has been read and approved by the Candidate’s Council. The representative will provide the candidate’s Rosary, Membership Card, and copy of “These Men We Call Knights” to the Host Council. He will also certify that the Candidate has signed the gaining Council’s Constitutional Role prior to arriving at the Exemplification.
