The representative will provide the candidate's Rosary, Membership Card, and copy of "These Men We Call Knights" to the Host Council. He will also certify that the Candidate has signed the gaining Council's Constitutional Role prior to arriving at the Exemplification.

football, we are often much too willing to dismiss the allegations against our 'football heroes.'
