# Let's see more Knights on the second Saturday

In November, the program raised \$1,619. We applaud all those that contribute to these efforts but we need to see more of the Knights.

If you cannot help on recycle Saturday, then drop off your recyclables (See below other than Saturday drop off). We look forward to seeing all of you Saturday, Jan. 10.



Our program is successful because those of you that take time to support it are appreciated and make the sacrifice that we greatly appreciate.

I whole-heartedly thank all my brothers who step up on Saturday, plus the Monday/Tuesday guys and gals. We need more of a commitment from all of our new as well as our veteran Knights. The program is a major fund-raiser for our council. We need all of you to participate whether for an hour or for a few.

We ran a survey at our December recycling and again the Knights made a very poor showing, I ask all of you to take note:

- Number of Knights dropping off recyclables: 26 (one more than last month) from more than 300 Knights in our council. It is time we step up.
- Number of parishioners dropping off recyclables: 98, we need to continue to promote this with our parishioners.
- Number of non-parishioners: 10

I ask all of you to think about the above and how to motivate more participation in our program. We're open to any suggestions. I have set a goal to double our take next year and it is not going to



come from the mobile home parks so what does that leave? All of us face a challenge and that includes you. We also have asked all of you, if you cannot drop off on our recycle Saturday to drop it off by the trailer and close the gate when finished.

- If dropping off books, magazines, paper or glass place them in the area provided

by the trailer and close the gate when done.

- If you are dropping off aluminum cans or plastic bottles, please throw them over the fence in the recycle area.

Please answer our request to support your fellow brother Knights.

A special thanks to our Monday and Tuesday morning crew for all the dedication and extra hours they put in to make the program a success.

We are now cutting the bindings off books with a saw which doubles the amount that we are making on the books. However, this is very time consuming requiring several Knights to spend additional hours cutting.
