It is gratifying to know that at this time of endless errands, a couple has infinite time to a mission of care and assistance. The receivers are our local military families, Camp Pendleton, Wounded Warriors and a homeless veterans residence. The givers are couple John and Tory Boegeman.

They collect and provide food, clothing, small household items, diapers, linens, toys, and hygiene items from various organizations and businesses, along with children's books and toys from our Monday and Tuesday morning Knight recyclers.

Last year Bogie, a nickname, collected and shipped an excess of 26,000 pounds of food. So far this year its 7,800. They do this weekly.

Their garage gets filled up with their daily collection and is emptied every Tuesday morning.

Tory has made more than 176 blanket sets for Camp Pendleton babies, patients at the Long Beach Veterans Hospital, and Wounded Warriors, along with the homeless veterans residence in 2014.

To date, 2015, Tory has made 20 and in the process of making 25 more. She calls it a Labor of Love. Bogie and Tory feel that our military families, past and present, need all the care and help we can give with love and gratitude. Bogie is a Korean War Veteran himself and a Life Member Knight.

Let us serve those who serve us or have served us. May God bless and keep everyone of them.

This is the only source of income since there is no funding the ID Drive. Main expenses are prizes for the game booths and lunch for clients and caregivers.

Urge no vote on assisted suicide Senate Bill 128

Once again, a bill to legalize the practice of assisted suicide has been introduced in the California State Legislature, in the form of Senate Bill 128 (SB-128).

This time, the bill has been announced in the Senate and is being authored by legislators Sen. Lois Wolk (D-Davis) and Sen. Bill Monning (D-Carmel).

Once more, this legislation will be vigorously opposed by a diverse group of organizations.



They represent doctors, people with disabilities, faith-based organizations, hospitals, hospice, minorities, the poor and the

uninsured.

Catholic social teaching tells us that we are created in the image of God; therefore, we hold life to be sacred from conception to natural death.

We believe that we are stewards—not owners—of our lives.

As such, the California Catholic Conference remains steadfast in our opposition to assisted suicide and any attempts to legalize it, and therefore, strongly opposes SB-128.

Assisted suicide represents misguided public policy, which would have numerous detrimental implications for vulnerable people and impact our society negatively.

Please ask your Senator to vote "No" on SB 128.
