Grand Knight's Report Make a pilgrimage through the holy door of opportunity

My brothers, I don't know if you noticed but there is a scent in the air, a certain feeling or vibration.

I can't describe it but I sense it. Perhaps you do as well.

The celebration of Christmas and the new years

are in the rear-view mirror and growing distant. The decorations are (mostly) taken down and the church is celebrating something called "Ordinary Time." But this feeling in the air is anything but ordinary.



On Dec.8 we began an Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy that will end Nov. 20. It's easy to fall

into the belief that there is plenty of time to respond to this occasion but I caution you, we don't have much at all.

Our activities expand to fill all available time and space so we must make the Year of Mercy a priority and begin participating now.

Our Bishop, Kevin Vann, has created two sites in Orange County that have a Holy Door or porta sancta, Holy Family Cathedral and the Mission Basilica in San Juan Capistrano. Most of us cannot make a pilgrimage to St. Peter's in Rome but we can all make onethrough a Holy Door in our Diocese.

Also be aware that a plenary indulgence is available in the Year of Mercy.

Pope Francis wrote a letter to the faithful when he wrote, "To experience and obtain the Indulgence, the faithful are called to make a brief pilgrimage to the Holy Door ... It is important that this moment be linked, first and foremost, to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to the celebration of the Holy Eucharist with a reflection on mercy. Insurance Report Update the beneficiaries on your policy

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies.

If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you want to receive the proceeds.

If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy, the date it was originally issued.

One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the

status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
