Brother Gene Ganley and our recycling program

(Editor's Note: Gene Ganley, one of the co-founding fathers of Council 9487, began the successful recycling program in 1990 with the help of Patty, his daughter. In the story below, she tells her own story about her beloved father and how he launched the program with her help.)

I went to a Council 9487 meeting in 1990. The question came up as to if the Council could make money by gathering old newspapers and selling them to a recycler.

I had been working with my homeowner's association on their recycling efforts and that program had just been discontinued.

I asked the Grand Knight, John Ruelas, that if the council wanted to recycle newspapers, would he like it for me to set up with a recycler. John said go with it!

I set it up with a recycler to furnish large and small bins in the church parking lot. It was decided that we would have a parish wide drop off of recyclables on the second Saturday of the month, as is still the schedule.

We had about a half-dozen Knights who worked that Saturday (no students yet). Our first collection netted \$200. We began putting monthly reminders in the bulletin. Our pastor, Fr. Bill Krekelberg supported the program from the beginning until 1991. He was followed by Fr. Ken Schmidt by granting us the use of the church facilities to run and grow the program.

I started to include a column in each Knights newsletter with a summary of the months' progress and acknowledging Knights and other friends who worked with the program, still led today by George Nothhelfer.

The original Knights who were involved were Ruelas, Eddie Brown, Robert Ramos, Jerry Gau, and yours truly. We were soon joined by Pete Kellen, John Ojeda, Hector Guzman, Jim Lamperis, E.O. Plache, Bob Morgan, Dick Petrash, Pat Walloch, Dan Ramella, Joe Schulte and Nothhelfer. (Gene: please forgive my omissions.)

Our recycler has always been the Allan Company. The Manager, Rob Allen has always been a long time supporter of our program.

Soon after, I was approached by a friend, not a parishioner, who was the president of the Homeowners' Association at Forest Gardens Mobile Home Park. He offered me an opportunity to recycle with them.

He set it up with the residents so that we were able to go through on Monday mornings and pick

Council helps fund room furnishings at veterans facility

Council 9487 made an initial donation of \$500 to furnish one room of the Potters Lane Veterans Housing facility that is nearing completion.

It has been in the works for the past two years.

Past Parochial Vicker Father Bill Barman is one of the chief fund-raisers for this project and is working in conjunction with American Family Housing. Brothers David Atkins, Patrick Larking, Rich Ingrassia, Stewart Imagawa and myself are working to put together a fund raising effort to reach a goal of \$5,000 to do a complete furnishing of one of the units. More information will follow shortly.

The facility is unique in its development and design. The 16 apartments are being constructed from shipping containers. The units are constructed from three steel containers welded together to create a modern, functional apartment.

Grand Knight Roger Sonnenfeld took time to visit the construction site in Midway City, and was

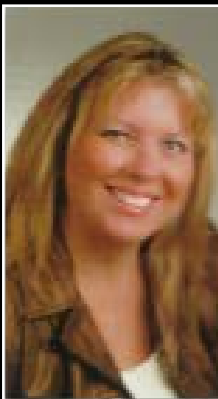
