In Need of Help: We are in need of several people to help on the Monday morning crew and some Brothers who can work a couple of hours three times during the week to sort out products from the drop off area and strip books.

This is needed to continue to keep our successful program going. We need help. We are now collecting all recyclables on Monday mornings and this has contributed to a better take since they do not have to store the items until the end of the month. Please call Gerry Dubois or myself.



Monday mornings: We need someone with a truck that could make pick-ups at El Toro or Lake Forest mobile home parks (your trip will be reimbursed if you use your vehicle for pick-ups). 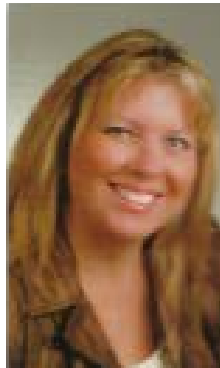
