The money raised from recycling goes to the Food Outreach Program, Isaiah House, Mary's Shelter, Laura's House, the Church and to the many charity works of the Knights of Columbus. Students in need of community service hours come and help on Big Recycling Saturday, every second Saturday of the month. Retired knights recycle items picked up from different locations every Monday morning.

We had a good recycle Saturday with a lot of teens that were a tremendous help. We need more brothers to participate. Please take some time and bond with the rest of us. We have a lot of fun and the cold beer at the end hits the spot.



In Need of Help: We are in need of several people to help on the Monday morning crew and some Brothers who can work a couple of hours three times during the week to sort out products from the drop off area and strip books. This is needed to continue to keep our successful program going.

Trucks needed on Monday mornings: We need one or two trucks that could be used as standby to assist on Monday mornings since we have changed the pickup schedule. We start at 7 a.m. and are usually done by 8:30. Please contact me or Ricardo or Gerry if you can possibly help us out. This program depends on you.

Monday mornings: We need someone with a truck that could be used as stand-bys could make pick-ups at El Toro or Lake Forest mobile home parks (your trip will be reimbursed if you use your vehicle for pick-ups). We can also use walkers (it is great exercise) to put the bags of recyclables in the trucks. There is no heavy lifting involved. We spend two hours on Mondays from 7-9 a.m.

During the week: We need a couple of people to come over and sort the goods in the drop-off area. This would be on a rotational basis of one week one time or less during the month.

You would have to check this area three times during the week. This is due to the number and amount of drop offs we are getting during the week. We already have an overflow on the glass and we have another week to go. We need help. Contact Ricardo Teano to sign-up.

High-Grade Paper (ledger paper): If any of you are aware of any architectural firms in the area we would like to contact them to pick-up their drawings. We can also use any file paper, which is valuable.

This paper is of great value since it falls into the category of high grade paper. We have had several of our Brother Knights drop off large loads of architectural drawings and we are grateful.

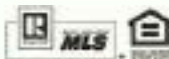
