Council golf tournament returns to Tijeras Creek course on June 30

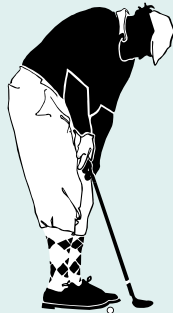

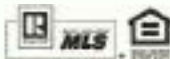
