Into The Breach

On Saturday morning, November 21st, Council 9487 presented an event jointly with Catholic Men's Fellowship that showcased the Knights of Columbus video series 'Into the Breach.' Inspired by the Apostolic Exhortation for Catholic Men written by Bishop Olmsted of Phoenix, the Knights of Columbus video series seeks to answer the question of what it means to be a Catholic man and how to live as a Catholic man in today's world.

Our Pastor Father Thomas led off the event with prayer and an invocation. Both Father Thomas and Father Martin have given their support and helped to promote this event. Their words indicated that this was really important for the men of the Parish.

The first two episodes in the series, 'Masculinity' and 'Brotherhood', were shown to the 36 men who attended, Brother Knights as well as other men in our Parish. Following each episode a small group breakout session was held to discuss such questions as, "Who is a man that you respect and why?" and "In what ways do the Apostles provide a model for a 'band of brothers' today? The men who attended were asked to write down their 'Greatest Need as a Catholic man.' Answers included:

"How can I help my friends and family have an appreciation for our faith in Christ?"

"I see our society moving away from Christianity and this needs to be reversed. So I need guidance in growing in faith and leading a holy life."

"I need a group of friends who can kind of force me out of my shell and help me learn to be a better friend myself."

"I would say my greatest need is to be more positive, active, and learn more inner self integrity."

"Men to look up to as spiritual leaders."

"The need to be closer to God."

"To be more connected and bonded together"

"More fellowship and figuring out ways to reach the next generation."

A survey was taken, and ten men who were not already Knights expressed interest in learning more about KofC.

Thirteen wanted to know more about CMF.

Thirteen also showed interest in attending the annual Parish Men's Silent Retreat at Mater Dolorosa.

We are looking forward to teaming up again in the future...and casting our nets out into the deep (Breach) and realizing a great catch. We are... after all... "Fishers of Men."
