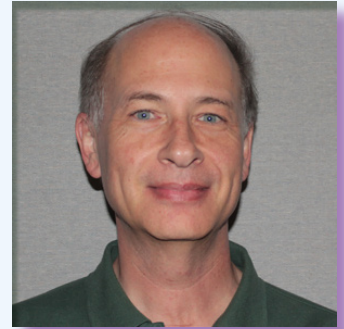

Grand Knight's Report

I am happy to announce Council 9487 qualifies for the Knights of Columbus Columbian Award this year. Recall that we made this a goal back in July, not so much to win the award – indeed, there is no place at the Church to even display whatever plaque or certificate is sent – but rather as a prod to keep us active. State Deputies across the nation are saying between 25% to 50% of their councils have been completely sidelined by the pandemic, not even meeting regularly much less putting on programs.



You did not let this happen to Council 9487. You continued to meet regularly, and you stood by our priests through it all – helping with drive-thru blessings, moving Mass and confessions outdoors, “traffic control”, hospitality, and myriad other ways. You continued to raise funds, most notably through the Recycling Program which had to adapt to the times but kept on truck’n nonetheless. The funds raised allowed you to continue donating to all the charities the council supports every month, in some cases even increasing the support, and the charities have been very grateful.

You generously supported the annual ID “Tootsie Roll” Drive and American Wheelchair Mission programs making up for drops in their collections and then some. You held important community events such as food drives for South County Outreach and blood drives for the American Red Cross. Despite the challenges, you even hosted faith programs such as Into the Breach. In short, the Columbian Award is a great accomplishment even in “normal” times. Achieving it this year is something special. Congratulations!

Let us finish the Columbian Year strong these last two months. On Mother’s Day weekend we will be distributing roses at all Masses and collecting donations for Obria. On its 2021 pilgrimage across North America, the Knights of Columbus Silver Rose will pass through Orange County for 5 days this month. Coming off the inspirational prayer service held by Santiago de Compostela for the Silver Rose last year, our parish and council have the honor of being selected again as a host site. Please attend the service on Wednesday, May 12th at 7pm and take advantage of this rare opportunity to see the Silver Rose. There will be another food drive on May 15th, a blood drive on May 26th, and a virtual Fraternal Benefit Seminar the evening of May 27th. All these programs need your help and participation. Details for all of them can be found inside this newsletter.

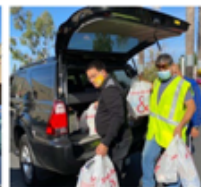

UPDATE YOUR BENEFICIARIES

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.


