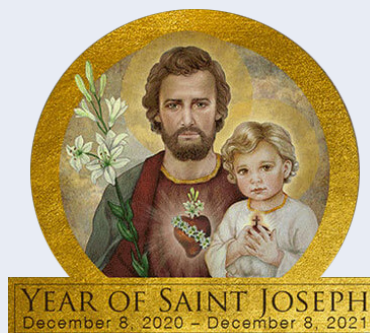

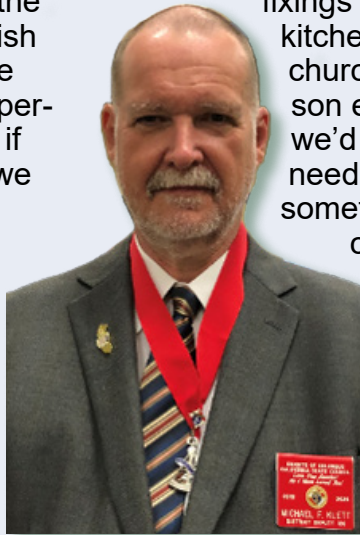


District Deputy's Corner

Dear brother Knights and family, brother Ricardo asked me to share a little bit of my story so here it is!

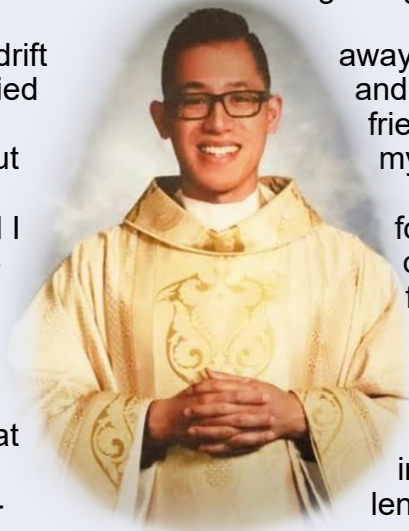
I grew up in a very religious family. We went to Mass every Sunday and often on Fridays and Saturdays as well. We prayed the Rosary nightly, served at church in different capacities, and every day after school, my dad would take me and my siblings to church to pray especially in front of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. These were the beginning seeds and sprouts of my faith.

In college (UC Irvine) I began to drift foot out, and after being dissatisfied life, God put into my life a good who began to ask questions about

He casted doubt on my faith, and I to his questions. By Divine Providence, this questioning did not cause me to fall further away from my faith. Instead, I found myself wanting to defend my faith and find answers to his questions.

I attribute this in no small part to my childhood upbringing in the faith and the many seeds of prayer that were planted in my life. This kept the dying embers of my faith burning in order to be stoked into flame at the right moment by my friend's challenges.

I found many answers to his questions (Catholic Answers was instrumental in this process), and the more answers I found, the more I became drawn to the truth of the Catholic faith, and the more I became drawn to the truth of it, the more I began to put it into practice, going to daily Mass, regular confession, weekend retreats, reading the Scriptures, making new friendships and conforming my life to the mind of Christ.

In the midst of this process of reversion, I began to sense a calling to become a priest (I was in my third year studying management and marketing at UCI). After wrestling with the call for over a year, I gave in to the call and followed the calling into the seminary. Seven years after intense spiritual, intellectual, human and pastoral formation, I was ordained a priest and assigned to Santiago de Compostela in Lake Forest as my first assignment.

As my dad "fathered" me in the faith after the example of God the Father, I am now a "Father" to many children. In fact, many of my children are older than me! Over my past two years at Santiago, I have been blessed to see God working through me to shepherd His people, and God working through His people to shepherd me. I'm excited to see what plans God has in store for us in the time ahead!

Santiago de Compostela - Hope & Wellness Ministry

The Hope & Wellness Ministry was begun several years ago. In the last 15 years, the ministry, led by Dave and Teresa Stokes, is focused on mental health. Today, the Hope & Wellness Ministry also partners with the Mental Health Ministry in the Diocese of Orange within the Office of Family Life. Through this affiliation Santiago can offer added support to parishioners and the community who suffer from the silent disease of mental illness.

The partnership allows access to training, referrals, resources, coordination, and networking that can make our parish a place of mental health education and awareness where we can provide space and prayerful relationships amidst mental health challenges.

Some of the educational and mental health awareness events we would like to bring to Santiago de Compostela are prayer services for mental health intentions, the Sanctuary Course for Catholics, training on mental health topics (such as Mental Health First Aid, effective listening, anxiety, recovery from depression, self-harm behaviors in adolescents), family/ caregiver and grief support groups.. There is also available membership for lay ministers through the Orange County Chapter of the Association of Catholic Mental Health Ministers that gather monthly to pray and share resources to stay connected and support the vision of reducing the stigma of mental illness.

Currently, Santiago de Compostela supports mental health programs such as the NAMI Family to Family Support Group and GriefShare support group. NAMI Family to Family supports families with loved ones who are experiencing mental illness. This program helps family members to understand the challenges their loved one faces and how to better communicate with them. NAMI Family to Family will be starting a new 12 week session each Wednesday starting July 14 from 6pm -8:30pm. To register, sign up on NAMIOC.ORG.

GriefShare is a grief support group that helps people through the pain and grief of losing a loved one. The program includes scripture based videos and discussions that share the healing love of Jesus. GriefShare meets for 13 weeks every Thursday from 6:30 – 8:30 in the parish hall Room J and K.

Lastly, Hope & Wellness Ministry is always looking for volunteers with a calling in their heart to support the mental health ministry. If you have such a calling, please contact Kanoe Martin at 4ckmartin@cox.net.
