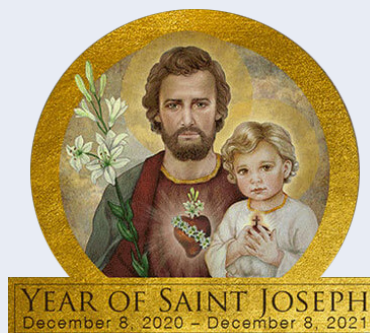

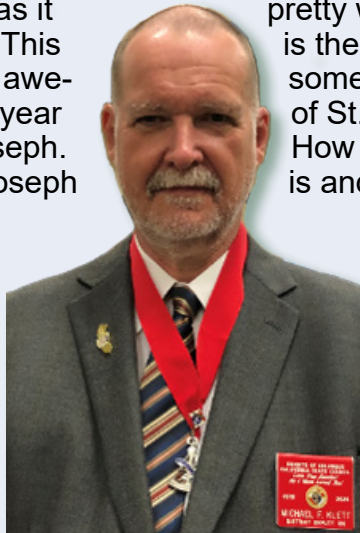
So, let's focus on getting the things done that we know need to get done.
