A consistent success was the monthly Food Drive. We started the food drive in November of last year. And to date, we have collected over 10 TONS of food! Yes, you read that right we have collected 20369 pounds of food. Enough food for close to 17,000 meals. Add



that on top of the approximately \$7200.00 we have collected, means that we were able to help provide over 74,000 meals total!

We will once again be having our monthly drive-thru donation event September 18th.

We had another successful Blood Drive at Bishop William R Johnson. A personal first for yours truly. Both my wife Jean and my son Kevin donated blood, Kevin for the first time and my wife the first time in over 8 years since recovering from Breast cancer.

In all we collected 35 units of whole blood.

Every Thursday evening this past month, A video series about the life of Jesus was offered to our parishioners. The Chosen allows us to see Jesus through the eyes of those who knew Him. No matter where you are in your journey with Jesus Christ, it spoke to you. Many brothers as well as their wives volunteered with all aspects including setup, leading discussion groups, and overall operations.

We also celebrated corporate communion last Sunday. Over 30 brothers celebrated the Holy Eucharist as a group at the 8:30AM Mass.

The Chosen Family of the Month is John and Elena Freeman. Congratulations!

John grew up in in the Midwest and his dad was the founding member of the Knights of Columbus at their parish. His father became the first Grand Knight with about a dozen men joining at that time. John was not one them; he was too young. John joined the Knights of Columbus in 1996 as a member of Council #1740 at Mary, Star the Sea parish in San Pedro when they moved to California. He is currently a third-degree knight.

She has a master's degree in education from USC and John has a master's degree in Communications from St Louis University. They moved from San Clemente to Foothill Ranch 6 years ago and joined Santiago at that time. They had many excellent parishes in easy driving-distance but Santiago was the Chosen one because of so many active ministries and were both very impressed

with how many men were very active in the parish.

They just celebrated their 24th wedding anniversary as they met late in life. John was the new Director of Religious Education (DRE) at Mary Star of the Sea and Elena was on the Board of Religious Education. They married a year later and have two grown children who both live in the Pacific Northwest. Elena is retired from Los Angeles County public schools. She was an administrator of a teacher trainer program for LA County schools. They both have a long career of education and have been catechists for the Church for over 40 years.

For the past 20 years John has specialized in facilitating RCIA programs whereas Elena specializes in helping younger children.
