

# Grand Knight's Report

### My Brothers,

The 1st quarter of the Columbian year is behind us, we are coming out of the pandemic bit by bit. Although we continue to present our meetings in a hybrid fashion, we find that, as expected, in person attendance is increasing while Zoom meeting participation is starting to wain. The data provided by our production coordinator Stewart indicates we are averaging 3 in attendance via Zoom.



September 13th-14th the National Catholic Prayer Breakfast was held in Washington, DC.

In the past month since our general meeting we had a full schedule. Approximately 15 Members of our council participated in the annual Retreat at Mater Dolorosa over the weekend of the 17th-19th.

We provided dinner for the Youth Ministry's Movie Night. In total 35 Dominos pizzas for the kids and the staff, Thanks to Dave Atkinson for coordinating with Lyanamar.

On Saturday 18th, Brother Mike Byrne coordinated the food drive. In addition to the food donated \$1290 was collected. A number of Brothers participated; Stewart, Angel, Vince, Jaime to name a few. Thanks for your service.

Last week I met with Dave Cortens, State Coordinator of the Ultrasound Initiative. I provided him with a check for \$4000 toward the Abortion Pill Reversal program as part of our Pro-Life program. We have a location for our ultrasound, more details to follow at the council meeting.

We will also be conducting a Respect for Life fundraiser - November 20th - 21st.

It will most likely take place on the plaza, and will include a tastefully done video that will be shown during Mass, after the Homily. It will be followed by information tables and breakfast to be served in the Pavillion.

Last Friday, the House of Representatives voted to pass the most radical abortion bill ever. Among other extreme actions, the so-called Women's Health Protection Act would:

- a. Allow abortion on demand nationwide throughout every stage of pregnancy
- b. Ban pro-life laws in every state and local government
- c. Force Americans to support abortions with their tax dollars
- d. Likely eliminate conscience protections for doctors

Please contact your Representative today -- either to express gratitude for voting against the bill or to express strong, but respectful, disagreement for voting for it, while urging him or her to reconsider support for this radical bill.

Additionally, it is likely that the Senate will also vote on this bill in the very near future. Please also contact your two Senators to strongly urge them to oppose the Senate version of this bill when it comes up for a vote.

Brothers, it is time to stand. That is, it is time to pray and to speak. As Pope Francis told us in his message for our 139th Supreme Convention: "In an age of epochal change, our societies need the courageous witness of men of faith and integrity, who can serve as a leaven of Christ's kingdom of justice and peace, holiness and truth." And so, let us pray and recommit ourselves to building a culture of life, to praying the rosary frequently, to fasting and doing penance. And let us speak: letting our members of Congress know — together with our family and neighbors — where we stand.

Standing comes with cost. And we can expect a fight as we work to defend innocent human life. This is why the Holy Father's call to follow St. Joseph as a man of creative courage is so important. St. Paul had many enemies, and his life was constantly threatened. Yet he was fearless, stating: "Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel" (1 Cor 9:16). Strong words, but also encouraging ones, because they make our duty so clear.

So brothers, we too must have the courage to preach the Gospel. We too must stand, with St. Paul and all Christians throughout history, for the poor, the weak, the abandoned, the elderly, and the most vulnerable of all — the unborn.

# IN MEMORIUM - HONORABLE BROTHER JERRY GAU

I did Not know Jerry Gau but have heard so much about him. I came into Bishop William R Johnson Council shortly before he passed away. I understand he was a force to be reckoned with.

Recently, I was at Monday Morning recycling and talking with a Founding Brother and co-Founder of our recycling Program John Ruelas. He mentioned that there is one person who did so much to establish our Council but he does not seem to get recognition. That man is Jerome J. Gau.

Bishop William R Johnson Council was founded February 12, 1967. Bishop Johnson was the 1st Bishop of Orange County. Fr. Bill Krekelberg, a Brother Knight was interested in forming a Council at Santiago de Compostela. A steering committee of Fr. Bill, Jerry Gau, Eddie Brown, Dick Gregg, Ray Rudy, Vince Holman, Jesse Messersmith and Henry Teterault was established. Don't feel bad, I do not remember many of these names myself.

The 1st meeting was held for this group November 1986. Membership drives were held in January 1987 and enough candidates and transfer members were found to establish the Council. District Deputy Harry Dillman set a 1st Degree for February 2nd. 28 members were exemplified and 8 more on February 10th. On February 19th the District Deputy requested to grant a Charter for our new Council consisting of 36 new members, 34 transfers, and 11 readmissions. The 1st meeting was held February 18th, 1987. Dick Gregg was elected Charter Grand Knight, Bill Breen was the Recorder, Thomas Grinnell Treasurer, Eddie Brown - Deputy Grand Knight, and Jerry Gau -Financial Secretary. This was a position Jerry held until he could not anymore due to health reasons.

Jerry was a Marine, is a Marine. You are always a Marine. He ran the Council from the beginning. He did everything by the book and did ensure the meeting ran efficiently according to Supreme guidelines. He was relentless at recruiting. This amazing Brother helped establish the Assembly Santiago de Compostela 2305, and became the Faithful Comptroller, a similar position to Financial Secretary with the 4th Degree. He did the same things there. This is the main reason many of the early members became 4th Degree Knights.

John Ruelas also told me he established a Knights council when he was in Service. Jerry was married to Nellie, was born January 8, 1926, died November 6, 2002. He retired from the Marines after 20+ years, and then retired from the Postal Service. He made his 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Degrees March 1, 1950. He was a Council member for 52 years. He made his 4th Degree September 1, 1967, probably right before the Assembly was formed. He was an Insurance Member and an Honorary Life Member when he passed.

I wish I could tell you more about Jerry. Primarily he lived for the Knights and Church. May he rest in Peace and be forever in our Prayers.
