Grand Knight's Report

Hundreds of 1000s of pro-life advocates gathered in Washington DC on Friday January 21st for the annual March for Life. Every year, it is one of the biggest demonstrations in the nation's capital, however, some of the movements most dedicated members won't be there. They will be where they usually are day in and day out; at pregnancy centers, caring for mothers, children born and unborn pregnancy resource centers like the one that we are buying an ultrasound machine for. They existed before the Supreme Court ruled on Roe versus Wade nearly 50 years ago, but their numbers have soared since abortion on demand was declared constitutional.



Here in Orange County, as well as in Los Angeles County, we too marched for the respect for life. We started at St. Norbert Catholic Church in Orange on Saturday the 22nd and we marched to Holy Family Church in Orange. It was approximately three miles, but we had over 300 fellow knights, and friends of unborn children.

Coming up in the next few months, the Supreme Court will make an important decision on the validity of Roe vs. Wade. All of our support is needed to defeat this unholy act. Next month, tentatively March 26th & 27th, we will have another "Respect Life" weekend, which will support the purchase of an ultrasound machine and abortion pill reversal.

Your support is valuable in this endeavor. It is my hope that we can continue this as a council and someday make abortion a thing of the past.

We will be voting on 2 items @ the General Meeting:

- 1. To increase the amount we spend on the ultrasound machine for Refuge Pregnancy Center, Indio.
- 2. Open Advocate position. I have appointed Brother Mark Angel.

He humbly explains that the recognition really goes to the team efforts of so many knights and parishioners.



But that's not the only volunteer work George does: He is a Eucharistic Minister, an Usher at the 8:30AM Sunday Mass, and head of the SDC Stewardship Council-PSA Committee. George was responsible for starting the popular daily devotion reading Living Faith booklets in English and La Fe Viva in Spanish. You could see him in his green council jacket every quarter fulfilling this obligation as a service of the Council to the churchgoers.

Versatile George cooked turkeys at Thanksgiving church dinners, worked with other brothers on the planning and construction of our wonderful pavilion, helped bring the wheelies from the Nursing home to Sunday Masses before covid, scheduling church ministries to take care of coffee and donuts at the pavilion on Sundays and doing church repairs and carpentry.
