Grand Knight's Report



My Brothers,

Ultrasound Initiative surpassed a major milestone on January 19, placing its 1,500th ultrasound machine through its signature program in support of pregnancy centers.

"Knights of Columbus believe in the dignity and worth of every human life," said Supreme Knight Kelly at the event. "We work tirelessly, through prayer and action, to support mothers and their children, both unborn and born."

Since the Ultrasound Initiative began in January 2009, Knights have donated ultrasound machines valued at more than \$72 million to pregnancy resource centers in all 50 U.S. states — including more than 100 machines in Florida, California and Texas. The rate of donations has accelerated in recent years, together with the number of medically certified pro-life pregnancy centers and requests, especially as centers expand and machines need updating. The 1,500th ultrasound machine was the eighth donation to First Choice Women's Resource Center, which has five locations in New Jersey. The organization requested a machine through the Ultrasound Initiative as it prepared to open its newest center near Rutgers University in November 2021.

"We want to give a woman all of the information she needs to make an informed decision. Offering an ultrasound is an important part of that process," explained Aimee Huber, executive director of First Choice, which also offers counseling and material support to expectant mothers. "Women can see the heart beating, can see the formation of the baby," added Huber, noting that an ultrasound machine helps women perceive the life of their unborn children. "It has a profound impact on the decision they make."

We will be focusing on raising funds for a 2nd Ultrasound machine and the ongoing effort to raise awareness for Abortion Pill Reversal. All Hands on Deck! Help is needed before and after 5:00pm Saturday April 2nd Mass and again on Sunday at the 7:00am, 8:30am, 10:15am and 12:00 noon Masses. I will have a table set up on the SDC plaza.

We are serving our final of three Lenten Dinners on Good Friday, April 15. We will need the usual mix of prep, servers and clean up. I am overseeing it and am asking for volunteers to help with the set up - beginning at 4:00pm. Dinner will be served at 5:30pm. Please help if you can. If you can't help, please come by and enjoy the dinner of Bouillabaisse. Please contact me at (949) 338-7237.

At next Wednesdays Council Business Meeting we will be voting on two important issues. We will vote on donating \$5000 to the Ukrainian relief effort as proposed by Brother George Nothhelfer. The monies will be sent to Knights of Columbus Supreme council who will in turn distribute it through the appropriate channels. This past Sunday the 2nd collection also for Ukrainian Relief netted \$22,079.

The 2nd issue we will vote to confirm my appointment of Rich Ingrassia to the position of Treasurer.

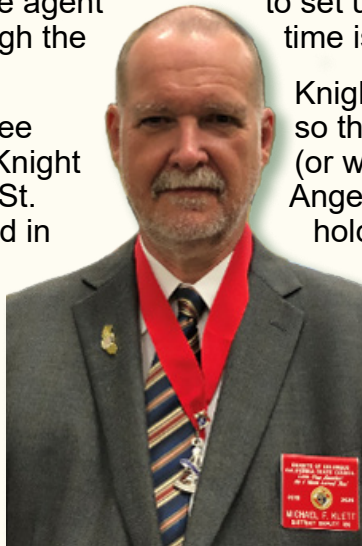

It's so amazing to introduce this Family of the Month, because this means the father, mother, and the children are all unselfish contributors, either to the church or council. Let me introduce the family of Jerry and Judith Clements who truly exemplify this honor.

Jerry was born and raised in Orange County. He attended college at Cal State Fullerton, go Titans! Jerry entered the RCIA program in 1995 and was fully initiated as Catholic on Easter Vigil in 1996. His Catholic Faith, with wife Judith, has been the center of their lives from the time they were married. They just celebrated 25 years of marriage on March 8th.

He co-founded a club that volunteers at assisted living facilities near Vanderbilt and recently went with a group of Pre-med students to volunteer in Guatemala where they assisted local doctors with their work in the rural areas. Jeremy was both an altar server, and lector at Santiago and also an Eagle Scout.

Their youngest son, Jaden, will be 18 on August 26th. He is a junior at Santa Margarita Catholic High School, is currently a lector at Sunday Masses and was previously an altar server. He is a member of the Red Cross, Families Forward, and Earth Club at Santa Margarita High School and is currently working on completing his Eagle Scout. As a family, the Clements volunteer at a local food bank.

Jerry currently is an adult altar server on Tuesday morning at the 8AM Mass and is a member of the liturgical media team that provides live-streaming to our homebound. He was one of the members of the first Men's Welcome Retreat Program. Additionally, he has been helping with hospitality and liturgical media during Simbang Gabi. Recently he has been helping with the re-launch of the VITA program at Santiago.

Jerry is appreciative of our KOFC council and all the good works the program does for our local community. You see the Knights in action all around the Church, the organization truly leads by example.
