# Grand Knight's Report



My Brothers,

I am very honored to have served you as your Grand Knight for the 2021-2022 Columbian year. As with every past Grand Knight, we start out with a set of goals we strive to achieve. I was no different. As a council we achieved the following: We held 3 Red Cross Blood Drives: 8/11/21, 12/13/21, 5/25/22. We collected 120 units.

We participated in unloading 300 wheelchairs at San Antonio de Padua for the K of C Global Wheelchair Mission.

As a council along with 300 Pro Life advocates walked in the OC March for Life on January 22nd 2022. through the streets of Orange.

We, in partnership with our Supreme Council, purchased an Ultrasound machine for the Refuge Pregnancy Center in Indio, CA.

As a parish family we held 2 Respect Life weekends, raising just shy of \$10,000

Bishop William Johnson Council Provided funding to Obria for Abortion Pill Reversal.

We hosted the "Silver Rose" and held a prayer service and overnight adoration on the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima, Friday May 13th.

We raised \$21,576 for the annual Intellectual Disabilities "Bill Breen Tootsie Roll" Drive.

Held 12 "Food for Families" Saturdays and collected 41,000 lbs of food, accruing over 600 service hours.

Our Recycling program grew by another \$21,000 with volunteer hours exceeding 3000.

We hosted 2 Fraternal Benefits Webinars

We achieved 153% of our membership goal

Finally, we met all the requirements for "Star Council"

Next Columbian Year: In response to the dramatic changes in abortion laws, regulations, and plans that positively advance the heinous abortion agenda in California There is an urgent need to update the pro-life techniques and responsibilities to address these radical new challenges.

The California Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB) recognizes the urgency of this need and has developed a "Vision" to be implemented by the Catholic Community as quickly as is possible. To this end, they launched "We Were Born Ready" for all parishes. We Were Born Ready has two tasks: 1) outreach to women and families through One Number One Solution (ONOS) and 2) grass-roots advocacy at the parish level to push back against anti-life measures in California.

The California Conference of Catholic Bishops unanimously approved ONOS to focus the Knights and the Parishes in the implementation of point 1 of this vision: outreach to women and families. ONOS marketing and communication hub encourages women considering a surgical, or chemical abortion, to visit a Pregnancy Resource Center for a free ultrasound and abortion pill reversal medication if requested. This gives the PRC staff the opportunity to discuss their alternatives and educate them about the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

More than a hundred and seventy pro-life pregnancy centers now operate in California. By the very nature of our founding, the Knights of Columbus are called to action to support these Centers as they serve unborn children and their mothers who are experiencing an unexpected pregnancy encouraging them to choose life for their baby.

# Grand Knight's Report (Cont'd)

Our Bishops, with this new initiative, reinforce this calling by proclaiming the inherent dignity of every woman, man, and child, born and unborn. It prioritizes the well-being of women, children, and families with both material resources, and solidarity, affirming, and empowering families to welcome children by birth, adoption, or foster care.

In cooperation with our Bishops, the Knights of Columbus are encouraged to get behind One Number One Solution to galvanize the PRCs. With our aid, pregnancy centers are better able to offer support to these families and help them choose life.

One Number One Solution directly helps pregnancy centers with the first-ever statewide outreach with the endorsement of the Catholic Church and other churches. It entails:

- 1) a statewide advertisement campaign to get more clients in for a free ultrasound scan and other services
- 2) a call center staff that directly supports all PRCs with phone and referral service
- 3) high-tech nurturing and appointment booking system that allows a woman to self-schedule for services
- 4) financial grants to select centers for improved appointment booking software
- 5) direct support from the Knights and Catholic Church endorsed by the bishops.

This will be a featured program for the State Council
