SEPTEMBER 7 BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

- New KofC candidates introduce themselves
 - New Candidate: Bill Ramirez Santiago parishioner since 1993. Excited to work Respect to Life efforts
 - New Brother: Peter Bethea
- Special guest Laura Garcia arrives to speak about efforts being undertaken by Santiago de Compostela, the Diocese of Orange, and the Catholic Church as a whole, to maintain Respect for Life efforts after the overturning of Roe vs. Wade.
 - Implores the council to vote NO on Proposition One in the upcoming election. This will prevent unrestricted (time, place, person) abortion access from being ingrained in California law.
 - Prevent tax money form being used to fund out-of-state residents from getting abortions in California
- Laura Garcia was accompanied by her husband, John. Both were honored as the Family of the Month for September.
- Br. Vince Vasquez addresses the council about the Diocese of Orange's planned Respect for Life march at the Christ Cathedral, Garden Grove. Saturday October 1st, 8am mass. Eucharistic procession to follow until noon.
 - The Bishop is putting a lot of support around this event. Done in conjunction with a large Vietnamese Catholic mass (1500 Catholics). 5000 expected attendees total.
- August Minutes accepted by the council.
- Newsletter coordination for September was a point of inquiry. Handful of Brothers reported not receiving previous newsletters and other distributions.
 - Email list to be investigated and maintenance plan put in place.
- Parish Cleanup Day was a success. About 6000lbs of trash items taken to dump. Garage doors painted. Landscaping done, etc.
- September 18th Exemplification at Holy Trinity was announced.
- Golf Tournament at San Juan Hills details announced to the council.
 - Later in the meeting, request for day-of volunteers to assist with running the Golf Tournament.
 - High price of tournament a result of inflated prices charged by the courses. Call for more players put out.
- Financial Report: \$19,782 in checking account. Updated Vanguard amount not available (about \$60,000 as of June).
 - Financial Secretary Report of Vouchers: \$5618.34. Took in \$13,919.96 for the month.
- No new membership report due to Br. Ricardo not being present.

SEPTEMBER 7 BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES Cont'd

- Men's Silent Retreat at Sierra Madre announced—same weekend as the Golf Tournament (September 16-17)
 - o "Who is Jesus Christ? Who are we?" is the theme.
- District Deputy present and provides more information on the October 1 Respect for Life event at Christ Cathedral. Procession to begin at 10AM. LA Diocese did a similar even with 10,000 people.
 - Aid and Support After Pregnancy program addressed. Details on Supreme's donation matching for Respect for Life efforts detailed. \$500 matching or 20% for ultrasound projects.
- Family Director Report: Bring your kids (or grandkids) to Mass. Keep Christ in Christmas magnets to be sold in advance of Advent (November). \$10 a piece, 50 magnets ordered for sale to the Parish. Poinsettia sales being looked into.
 - Children's Christmas Poster creation event planned. Wintery refreshments and gift cards for the kids.
 - o Mental health and the family article in the works for October Newsletter.
- Br. Phil will sing the National Anthem at the September 27 Angels game.
- Parish Festival coming up in October. Halloween theme. American food booth and beer garden. Trunk or Treating.
- Brother Benny will be on vacation the first weekend of October. Needs back-ups for Hospitality. Supporters volunteered.
- Budget voted on and approved.
- Brother Stewart voted as successor to Brother Richard as Treasurer.
- WGK announces that \$275 will be allocated to send a specific brother to the Retreat.
- Brother Mike Sofka presents plans to raise money for an ultrasound machine at a pregnancy center in Glendale. KofC Council 9487 looking to contribute \$5000 to the cost. About \$4350 already collected. \$500 to be allocated this meeting. The rest in October.
- ID Drive needs a new Brother to champion the cause.
- Good of the Order and closing prayers conducted.
