BLESSED MICHAEL MCGIVNEY - A MODEL FOR OUR TIMES

Apostle for the young, Protector of Christian Family Life and Founder of the Knights of Columbus, Blessed Father McGivney was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America, and he remains a model today. His example of charity, evangelization and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide the Knights of Columbus around the world.

Blessed McGivney is the eldest of 13 children (six of whom died young) whose parents were devout Catholic Irish immigrants. He was born on August 12, 1852, in Waterbury, Connecticut and passed on August 14, 1890, two days after his 38th birthday, at St. Thomas rectory after contacting pneumonia during the modern viral pandemic known as the Russian Flu.

Blessed McGivney began work at the early age of 13 in a local spoon factory to help his family, until he entered the seminary in Montreal, Canada. He was known for his seriousness and studiousness, but also for his sense of humor and baseball skills. However, when his father a metal former passed he came home from Montreal and considered returning to work to support his family, until Bishop Hartford persuaded him to continue his priestly studies closer to home; this time in Baltimore.

It should also not be surprising during this period of history, life expectancy was short for priests in Connecticut when the population was growing in America, disease was common, and priests were overworked.

After his priestly ordination in Baltimore in year 1877, he was assigned to St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut under the administration of an ailing pastor and a crushing parish debt. Through his creativity, vision, leadership and hard work, the church was able to raise sufficient money and continue providing ministries. Blessed McGivney saw that many young men were neglecting their religion and turning to alcohol abuse. In response, he founded the St. Joseph's Total Abstinence and Literary Society; a group that helped young men stay strong in faith and become active in their communities.

He was also able to listen to the hopes and dreams of so many young people and counselled those who faced difficult decisions and hard lives, which he also experienced firsthand at an early age. Young people were drawn to him not only simply as a mentor but as an outstanding soul who knew their plight. Parishioners of all ages, especially the parents, were thankful and elated for this young priest who never even took a vacation.

In the late 19th century during the time of his priesthood, anti-Catholic sentiment primarily towards Irish Catholic immigrants were very rampant in a protestant dominated Connecticut. Catholics were not welcomed into the mainstream of society and were mostly offered the most difficult, low paying and dangerous jobs in factories, construction and railroads. Unemployment was staggering for Irish Catholics. This resulted in the breadwinner too often died young of overwork or accident, leaving behind a widow and children who had few means of financial support.

Blessed McGivney envisioned an order that would help Catholic men to remain steadfast in faith while providing for their families. He worked tirelessly to offer practical solutions to immigrant Catholics... As a result, he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882, in honor of Christopher Columbus. The fraternal society was created to provide spiritual support to men and offer material and financial resources to families that had suffered the loss of a breadwinner. Today, through Blessed McGivney's vision and ministry, the Knights of Columbus is one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world, reaching more than two million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and Europe and with their families continues to seek out the Blessed McGivney as a heavenly helper in times of need and spiritual guidance...

HELPING HANDS LOVING HEARTS MINISTRY

A little over a year ago, in the winter of 2022, Fr. Thomas Naval approached 4 of our council members individually and requested that they work together to get a new parish ministry going.

Brothers Ricardo Teano, Dennis Fung, Angel Garcia, and myself were tasked with establishing the Helping Hands, Loving Hearts Ministry.

The objective of this ministry is for its members to be on call to respond to requests for help as parish activities come up. Most recently the ministry stuffed the Easter eggs, which were given to our parish children, with candy and a note. 800 plus eggs were stuffed in less than 2 hours by about 25 members of the Helping Hands, Loving Hearts Ministry.

This ministry has also helped to prepare parish mailers such as the PSA drive mailer. They aided the Camino de Santiago ministry last summer with the coordination of the bussing of Camino participants to the Lake Forest Sports Park.

Part of the beauty of this ministry is it allows people who want to be part of a ministry, but have busy schedules, the opportunity to volunteer as activities come up. All that is required is to contact one of the ministry leaders and provide them with contact information such as a phone number and/or email address. When a need arises for help, the ministry leaders contact those who have registered and ask for volunteers who are available at a specific time and place. Details are provided of what the activity will be.

The Helping Hands, Loving Hearts Ministry is a great way to help with the needs of our parish and meet fellow parishioners with only an occasional time commitment. Brothers Ricardo, Angel, Dennis or myself (Mark) would be happy to add you to the ministry volunteer list if you feel inclined to participate.
