In the Roman Catholic Church, the Deacon is an ordained Minister ranking immediately below a priest. He has undergone a five year course of study to the formation program. Deacons pray the Liturgy of the Hours each day. These are the 150 Psalms and Scriptural readings from the Old and New Testament that every cleric is expected to pray daily. Deacons aid priests in their parish duties by visiting the sick, providing spiritual guidance in the community and acting as a servant of God. In addition, Deacons can witness marriages, perform baptisms, preside over funeral burial services outside of Mass, distribute the Holy Communion, and preach the homily.

Brother Knights, we are blessed to have Deacon Manuel in our midst. No wonder Deacon Manuel is our honored knight of the month. Let us congratulate him and his family.

Deacon Manuel and his wife, Maria, were raised Catholics with a very strong Catholic belief as you will see later. Deacon Manuel was the deacon at Our Lady of the Pillar Church in Santa Ana before he was transferred to Santiago de Compostela last August, 2022. He said that his assignment to Santiago has been a wonderful experience. You can see him assisting Father Thomas during Mass, leading the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Fridays. He also helps with the RCIA Adult Faith Formation and many other Spanish ministries. His support with the Hispanic retreats and the different ministries in the church, he hardly leaves him time to help the knights. They have been married 35 years and together they do pre-marital talks three times a year, take Holy Communion to the Memorial Hospital in Fountain Valley, and visit prison.

the State Representative. What an honor. He and his great wife attend Mass regularly and he is a lector at their church. A COLUMBIAN YEAR FULL OF CHARITABLE ACTS

Brothers, as we hear in our Exemplification ceremony "the first and foremost principle of our Order is Charity, the greatest of all virtues and the crowning glory of a Christain life." We further hear that "Charity is that priceless gift placed by God in the human soul to measure man's allegiance to his Creator. Charity is a duty, not a courtesy. It is an obligation imposed by Heaven upon rich and poor alike."

This past Columbian year The Bishop Johnson Council 9487 of Santiago de Compostela performed numerous acts of Charity. Each Charitable act is noteworthy in and of itself but when the entirety of all the charitable acts is reflected upon it is truly amazing what our council has accomplished!

The following list summarizes some key works of Charity, though as lengthy as it is, it is not intended to contain every charitable act performed by our council, rather the intention is to provide highlights of the last Columbian year.

Our council, along with The American Red Cross hosted 3 successful blood drives during the course of the year collecting 115 units of blood.

Our council; 9487:

Helped to collect and sort over 8 tons of food, along with thousands of diapers, donated by our parishioners for the South County Outreach Food Bank.

Donated \$10,000.00 to the Special Olympics; \$11,000.00 was donated to Therapeutic Riding Stables to support the treatment of Autistic and learning disabled children.

Awarded \$9000.00 in scholarships to children and grandchildren of council members who attend Catholic Schools.

Donated over \$5,000.00 to Obria and Mary's place to aid mothers in need who chose life for their babies.

Donated \$2,500.00 to the Disciples of Mary Seminary in the Philippines. Our Council makes an annual donation to the seminarians. The donation is multiplied 56 times as we convert dollars to peso currency. Our Father Thomas attended and completed his priesthood studies at this seminary.

Twice during the last year performed clean up and light repairs to our parish campus.

Conducted a car wash with parish children to raise funds for the Children's Religious Education program.

Provided financial support to both the Men's and Women's Parish Renewal Retreat programs.

Conducted a food booth and a beer garden at the parish festival.

Generously donated hours and hours of time, along with talents by council brothers at all of the parish events and activities.

Our parish is flourishing at this time. Father Thomas has said that the Pastors of flourishing parishes all say that the stronger their Knights of Columbus Councils are the more their parish flourish. Let us take a moment to acknowledge what we as a United Council have accomplished and then move forward knowing there is much more for us to do!
