BROTHERS WE ARE NEEDED AT 1ST FRIDAY ADORATION

In the September State Council newsletter our State Deputy wrote "We also have the mission that was given to us at the beginning or our Order in 1882 by Father McGivney to bring men and their families to a closer relationship with God and to help those in need." In the same newsletter our State Chaplain wrote "May I echo the same invitation to you, worthy brothers, Our indispensable and foremost mission is to foster a personal encounter with God through the Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist. It is necessary that we initially encounter God before we can draw our families, our faith community, and others closer to Him."

I have cited these two quotes because there is an area that our council must do better. Several years back our council was asked, and accepted

the privilege of keeping our Lord company during First Fridays Adoration. On the first friday of the month, after the 8am mass and until before the saturday 8am mass Our Lord is exposed in the monstrance for Adoration in our chapel. Our council originally had a team of 2 volunteers and 1 alternate assigned to each hour of Adoration. Over time brothers have moved out of the area, some have passed away, and the pandemic interrupted this practice so now there are several hours where no brothers are present during First Friday Adoration. We need to correct this. Our council has over 300 members and we need a total of 69 Knights to volunteer to stay with Our Lord.

At September's First Friday Adoration the Lord asked me to tell my brothers he desires to spend time with them. My older brother has passed away and my younger brother lives in Ohio so I know the Lord meant my Brother Knights.

Please commit to spending an hour in Adoration on First Fridays. There is a sign in schedule that brother John Ojeda has so you can contact him, myself, or Grand Knight Dave Atkins. You can also simply show up on First Friday and write your name in on the sign in sheet in the chapel. This is one of the most important things we are asked to do as a Knight and I know our council will respond accordingly

I want to start out by saying, this is a retreat that is centered around you and Our Lord Jesus Christ, and no one else. There will be no distractions to get in your way. Being at Mater Dolorosa Passionist Retreat Center feels so tranquil and peaceful. The goal of the retreat center is for you to have a closer relationship with God, not to study God, but to experience God. To quiet all the noise and allow you to reset, recharge, and refocus. I felt a serene and peaceful feeling over me as soon as I passed through the gates of the retreat center. The feeling continued throughout the weekend. I can guarantee that if you attend this experience, it will change your daily life.

When you arrive, on Friday evening, you will be greeted by a wonderful and accommodating staff, and you will meet other men. That will be the extent of any personal interaction. Your weekend is for you and Our Lord. You will be assigned a room to yourself, and you will have the basic essentials and nothing else. I recommend turning off all outside distractions and reading the Bible they provide for you in your room. I also recommend that you take a journal to record your thoughts and feelings as you go through the weekend. You will be given a weekend schedule that includes wake up times, all your mealtimes, conferences, spiritual times, and mass times. During your stay, you will have the opportunity to check out the grounds and all that the retreat center provides. Take advantage of this time and immerse yourself with our Lord.

As this was my first time at the retreat center, I had a chance to experience the Stations of the Cross, Sacred Heart Plaza, the Garden of the Seven Sorrows, and the rest of the grounds. I must say that I could feel the presence of our Lord and I had this inner peace and clear mind as I walked the grounds and saw a few deer grazing on the grounds throughout the weekend. If you ever need a weekend for just you and our Lord, this is the retreat you need to attend, you won't regret doing this for yourself.
