To begin, German is part of the Santiago Audio Visual Liturgical Media Ministry. He helps project the celebration of the Sunday liturgies to the altar screen. This ministry has done much good to the solemn participation of our parishioners to the Holy Mass. Secondly, German, with his brother knights, has been an early Monday morning recycler. He has been doing this even before the covid years. Thirdly, German is also an altar server in funeral services where servers are hardest to find. The reason is, the funerals are scheduled mostly on weekdays at 10:00 AM. If these contributions are not enough, let us go on.

His wife Malou is also very involved in the church. With her melodic voice she is a member of the Santiago Minstrel choir. On Monday mornings, Malou is one of the counters of the church collections. Together they serve as Directors of Service for the Marriage Enrichment Formation Program (MEFP), a marriage ministry based at Saint Irenaeus in Cypress. MEFP holds a weekend marriage retreat for

couples twice a year. They are also active participants of the Filipino Cursillo Diocese of Orange (FCDO) where German serves as the Treasurer. FCDO holds two retreats every year, one for men, and one for women. They both have been serving for the FCDO retreats since joining the Cursillo in Christianity movement. When called in, he also serves during the retreats of the Los Angeles Chapter.

German has been a knight since May, 2019. He joined because the knights provided the avenue for him to serve not just the parish but also the community. He has always admired the work that the knights do and has always wanted to be part of it, but never mustered the courage until his retirement. Now he is a Sir Knight after achieving his 4th degree level on September 30, 2023 at Christ Cathedral.

Malou and German are 'cradle Catholics.' They have been parishioners of Santiago de Compostela for 26 years and raised their four children in the Catholic Faith. All four of them received the Sacrament of Confirmation in Santiago. They have been married 38 years. They have three beautiful grandchildren.

ATTENDING THE "I AM" CONFERENCE

The Catholic Church of the United States has undertaken a National Eucharistic Revival Movement which will lead to a National Eucharistic Congress July 17 - July 21, 2024 in Indianapolis Indiana. The objective of this movement is to rejuvenate our connection with Jesus in the Eucharist. Our Diocese held a Eucharistic Congress on Oct, 20 th and 21st to fulfill their part of this Revival movement. Father Thomas asked for our parish Eucharistic Ministers to attend this Congress as well as any parishioners who felt a desire to attend.

On Saturday Oct. 21st, twenty-six of us boarded a bus between 6:00AM and 6:30 AM in our parish parking lot and traveled to the Christ Cathedral in Garden Grove to attend this congress. Before the bus departed

I was asked to lead the bus passengers in prayer for us to experience a deepening of our oneness with our Eucharistic Christ. Around 7AM we arrived at the campus of Christ Cathedral. We were one of the first groups to arrive and were quickly guided to the check in tables where each of us was given a bag containing a program for the congress, 2 books, a prayer card, and some snacks.

We then headed to the Our Lady of La Vang Shrine where the day's events would start with a Trilingual Mass at 9:00AM. We met up with several more parishioners who had carpooled to the Cathedral and made arrangements to sit together for the Mass. Since Mass was not scheduled to begin for another 90 minutes, many of us went walking around the campus where 28 exhibitors and vendors were set up. PGK and current Chapter President Vince Vasquez was manning the chapter Knights of Columbus booth where prayer cards and rosaries were being distributed. In the cultural center a very impressive exhibit of Eucharistic Miracles was on display. We are going to see if this beautiful display can be brought to our parish in the future.

At 9:00 AM the Trilingual Mass of the Transfiguration (English, Spanish, and Vietnamese) was concelebrated by our Bishops and several diocesan Priests. Over 2000 people were in attendance and it was such a spiritually uplifting experience. The music was heavenly, the sense of community was so strong, and the message of Christ's presence in the Eucharist was so enriching, it was a true faith building experience.

A Eucharistic Procession followed the Mass from the Our Lady of La Vang Shrine to the Large Gallery. The Knights of Columbus Honor Guards led the procession.

After the Mass there were 3 speakers scheduled with presentations for each language (English, Spanish and Vietnamese) throughout the day. Adoration and Confession were also available all day.

At 4:00 PM the Eucharistic Procession went from the Large Gallery back to Our Lady of Lavang shrine along with Benediction. Then there was a procession of parish flags, GK Dave Atkins carried our parish flag. The day ended with a celebration of the Sunday Vigil closing trilingual Mass. The **I AM** conference was truly a grace filled day for all who participated.



WALK FOR LIFE AT CHRIST CATHEDERAL

TOP 10 FACTS TO KNOW ABOUT LONG TERM CARE PLANNING

November is National Long-Term Care Awareness Month, an event recognized by Congress and a number of States. To mark the occasion, here are 10 interesting facts shared by the American Association for Long-Term Care Insurance.

4 – Average out-of-pocket costs are \$140,000 for those individuals who utilize paid long term support services (LTSS). Roughly 17 percent will spend over \$100,000 on LTSS. Almost 9 percent will spend over \$250,000 on LTSS.

5 – By 2040, the total prevalence of Alzheimer's disease and related dementias in the US is expected to approximately double from 7.2 million to nearly 13 million, with 8.5 million women and 4.5 million men expected to develop dementia.

6 – For those requiring high levels of LTSS, individuals and families pay 55 percent of long-term care costs out of pocket.

7 – Currently, the majority of older single-person households are female. Women comprised 74 percent of solo households age 80 and over.

8 – Some 7.5 million Americans have some form of longterm care insurance. Two-thirds of all new individual longterm care insurance claims pay for care needed by women.

9 – The long-term care insurance industry paid out \$11 billion in benefits to some 310,000 individuals with insurance protection in 2019. The number will increase each year as the current number of policyholders grow older and, as a result, are more likely to begin their claim.

10 – 69.5 percent of new claims start after the policyholder reached age 80. If you live a long life, you are very likely to need long term care. You'll be very glad you have a policy to pay benefits.
