PGK John Piccolo was standing outside the church one day in 2008, recruiting when Bob decided to sign the Form 100. He joined to meet more folks in the congregation and to do more service work and philanthropy. Bob's dad was a knight when Bob was growing up and together with many of the older dad knights influenced him and inspired him to join the Knights of Columbus. Bob is a 4th degree knight and a past grand knight of our council.

Bob came from a large Catholic family from Central Illinois. He has 7 siblings (2 sisters, 6 brothers). He is currently divorced, but the mother of his children (Jackie) went through the RCIA program at St Killian in the mid-1990s. They moved to Santiago de Compostela in the early 2,000s for the user-friendly religious education program for their children. His two children are Jacob (26) and Julia (22). Both were active in the Summer Vacation Bible program as attendees and later as Youth Program Directors. They both also volunteered as Altar Servers. Jacob was voted as "Altar Server of the Year" back a few years ago and he is an Eagle Scout (BSA). His Eagle Scout project was a shadow box of the elements from the Periodic Table. It now hangs on the wall outside the science classroom at Serrano Middle School in Lake Forest. Jacob and Julia both joined the Greek system at college and did volunteer philanthropic work thru their fraternity and sorority.

Bob, on his own, did fundraising for charities through direct mail marketing programs and raised monies for many charities over the years. Although it is true you will no longer receive pancake related E-mails, you will also not receive newsletters, prayer requests, nor anything else! Again, there is only one mailing list, and you are either on it or not. To re-subscribe, return to the Newsletters page, and complete the form again.
