OUR COUNCIL'S BREAKFAST BURRITO TEAM

One of our Grand Knight, Dave Atkins, priorities for our council is to find new sources of revenue streams so that our many charitable activities and donations can continue going forward. The poinsettia sales at Christmas time and hosting car washes are 2 activities that were started last year but have grown in their success under our current GK Dave Atkins.

When the idea of making and selling breakfast burritos after the early Sunday Masses was proposed, GK Atkins asked that our newer and younger members head up this activity. Brother Ryan Moussavi volunteered to take ownership of it and assembled a team of brothers to make it happen.

On Sunday, January 14th, Ryan's team of brothers conducted our first breakfast burrito sales after the 7am, 8:30am and 10:15am Masses. It was a very successful event!

The team made about 220 burritos with a net profit of \$515.00 for our council. Ryan's team consisted of Brothers: Michael Sarosa, Ivan Lopez, Danny Reyes, Nick Thomo, Andrew Zumkehr, Pat Larkin, Pat Bole, John Teeter, Roger Sonnenfeld, Stewart Imagawa, and GK Dave Atkins. Brother Ricardo Teano promoted the event and directed parishioners to the sales area.

For the most part, Brother Ryan had the newer and younger team members work in the kitchen preparing the burritos and the more senior brothers manned the table selling the burritos. GK Dave Atkins said we will have a breakfast burrito sale 4 times a year, once every 3 months, and the goal is to net \$1,000.00 each time.

Thank you to the brothers who participated in making the first breakfast burrito sales event a success. This event was a great example of our principles of Unity, Fraternity, and Charity being put into practice.

Again, there is only one mailing list, and you are either on it or not. To re-subscribe, return to the Newsletters page, and complete the form again.
