WET MORNING FOR BROTHER KNIGHTS & PARISH YOUTH

Brother Mike Byrne organized another car wash which was held on Saturday February 17th from 9AM to 12 noon. Over 20 Knights and 10 youths worked the car wash. It was held in the lower parking lot behind the rectory.

Since the possibility of rain had been forecasted, advance tickets were not sold but rather the \$10.00 donation per vehicle was collected at the first station in the parking lot. Next was a station for spraying down the vehicles. After that was a station for hand washing the vehicles where specially designed wash mits and car wash soap were used by a team of about 6. The next station was a rinsing station. After that was a station where two Knights used blowers to remove the water from the vehicles. Finally, the last station was the drying station where micro-fiber towels and soft cotton towels were used to dry the vehicles.



The morning started out with light sprinkles, but Brother Mike and his team carried on, and by 9:45 the precipitation had stopped. The weather did have an impact on the turnout and about 50 vehicles were washed. Several other people gave cash donations without having their cars washed. Our council raised about \$650.00 between car wash sales and non-wash donations.

After the car wash, the participants enjoyed a lunch; consisting of hot dogs grilled by PGKS John Teeter and Pat Larkin, macaroni salad prepared by Jean Sofka, and potato salad, chips and brownies which were donated by Leif and Bonnie Ranestad.

Thank you to Brother Mike Bryne and all the brothers who participated. It was another great example of our principles of Unity, Charity, and Fraternity, being put into practice by our council.

It was also nice to work with some of our parish youth, and Father Thomas worked the rinse station for a significant part of the morning!

Another car wash will be conducted by our council later this year. The dates and details to be announced at a future monthly business meeting.

We come from many places. And backgrounds. And stages in our lives. But we are all of one faith. A fraternity of men striving to better ourselves and our world.

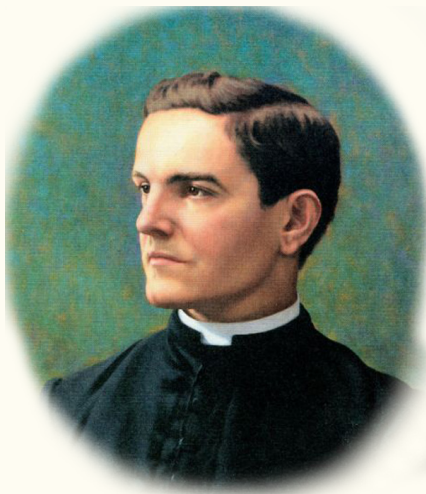

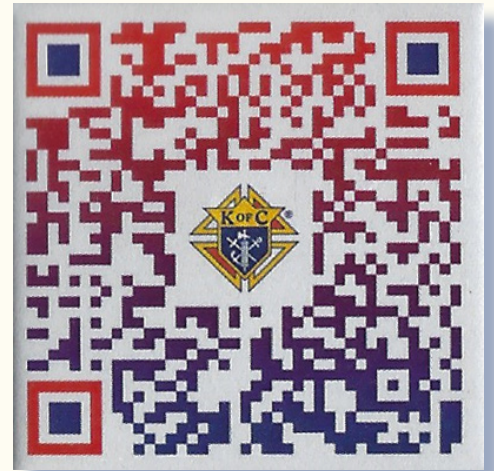
The Knights may be surprised at how many booklets have been distributed during this time - crates upon crates; a dollar total of over \$20,000 thus far! Each

VIDA - FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION MINISTRY

The Volunteer Income Assistance Program (VITA) was relaunched at Santiago de Compostela Parish in 2022 through Father Thomas' initiative. Father Thomas asked Judith Clements (and of course she volunteered her husband, Jerry Clements to relaunch the program and coordinate bringing together volunteers.

The program offers FREE tax preparation and eFiling assistance to low-to-moderate income individuals, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and those with limited English-speaking abilities, not only in Santiago de Compostela Parish but also in the neighboring communities of Lake Forest.

Since its relaunch, the Santiago der Compostela VITA Ministry has grown from having just 7 active volunteers to now having 27 active volunteers, six of whom are Knights of Columbus.

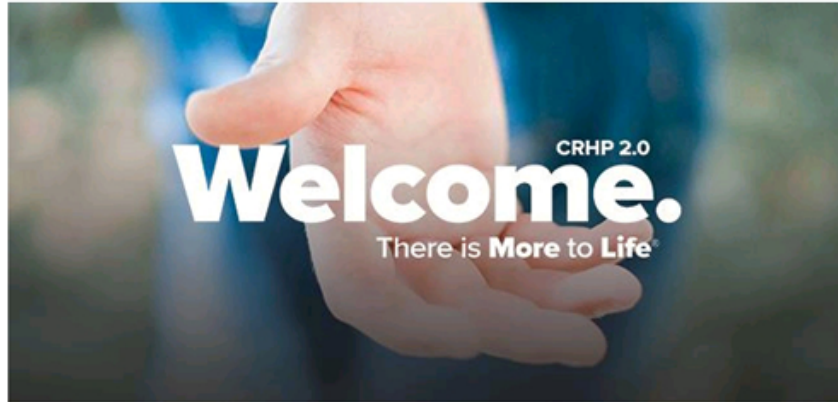
The ministry has grown from 57 returns filed in 2022 to an estimated 250 returns filed by the end of the 2024 tax season, and \$11,000.00 contributed from the SDC VITA Ministry to the building fund in 2023.

AWARENESS MONTH FOR THE INSURANCE INDUSTRY

Happy Easter! Easter is the very end of March, the 31st, so I will take this time to hope you conclude your Lenten observances with a celebration of the Resurrection!

March is Ethics Awareness Month for the insurance industry. Oxford Languages defines ethics as “moral principles that govern a person’s behavior or the conducting of an activity” In many professions there is an ethical code that practitioners are to observe. In medicine, we’ve boiled down the Hippocratic oath to, “First, do no harm.” Attorneys have the American Bar Association’s “Model Rules of Professional Conduct.” In psychology there are codes of conduct for both treatment and for research.

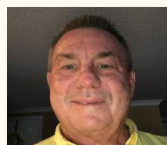

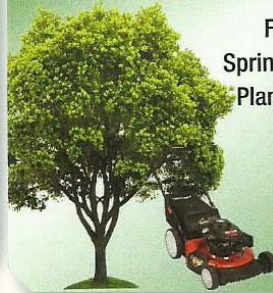
