FATHER MICHAEL J. MCGIVNEY RELIC - COUNCIL 9487

Our star recruiter, Brother Ricardo Teano, has made another very significant contribution to our council. He has obtained a third-class relic of Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney. Along with the relic there is a certificate of authenticity and a write-up on the meaning and purpose of relics.

Being a third-class relic basically means that the cloth in the relic touched the tomb of Blessed Michael J. McGivney. From the house of joppa: "Relics are divided into three classifications. A first-class relic is a body part of a saint, such as bone, blood, or flesh. Second-class relics are possessions that a saint owned, and third-class relics are objects that have been touched to a first or second class relic or the saint has touched him or herself."

When Brother Ricardo showed me the relic and documentation that he was gifting to our council I immediately thought to myself that Brother Angel Garcia could make a display case that would be a worthy holder for the relic. I talked with Brother Angel about what I envisioned for a display case, laminated the documents and left the rest up to Brother Angel.

Brother Angel crafted a display case that beautifully houses the relic and documents. His creativity and workmanship are outstanding, and our council is quite blessed to now have the relic, displayed in the case as a permanent addition to our council.

At future monthly council meetings the relic of Blessed Father Michael J McGivney will be displayed during the opening and closing prayer parts of our meeting. Additionally, if a brother is ill or has a special prayer intention that they would like to ask for Blessed Fr. McGivney's intercession, our Grand Knight may lend the relic out to the brother who requests it.

On behalf of our entire council, I want to thank Brother Ricardo Teano for donating the relic, and Brother Angel Garcia for bringing my vision of a display case to fruition. We are surely the only council with a relic of Blessed Michael J. McGivney displayed so beautifully.

CORPORATE COMMUNION

When I first joined the Knights, I got confused hearing brothers mention, "Corporate Communion." What has the Eucharist to do with big business? Brother Mike Klett finally explained to me, "Corporate" here means, "as a body". A more colloquial phrase might be, "Attending Mass Together."

Bishop Johnson Council has a beautiful tradition of holding Corporate Communion the 5th Sunday of every month having 5 Sundays. Covid lockdowns interrupted the practice but, thanks to recent Grand Knights, the tradition has been revived and is now thriving! A case in point was April 28th when dozens of Knights and their families attended Mass "as a body."

According to the council Bylaws, "The Council shall receive Holy Communion in a body during the Easter period." The 5th Sunday rule normally makes that automatic, but this year there are no 5th Sundays during the Easter season, apart from Easter itself -- a challenging day for Corporate Communion. So, April 28th was our substitute.

The next Corporate Communion is June 30th. To participate, come with your family to the 8:30am Mass. Sit on the left near the choir. The council banner will be there. If you can, wear your green council shirt, badge, or other Knights apparel. See you there!

SPRING - A TIME OF RENEWAL AND UPDATE

We spend six weeks each year during Lent fasting, praying and almsgiving. We hope to unite our fasting and praying with Jesus' 40 days of fasting and praying in the desert, to focus on preparing both our inner and outer selves to celebrate the great Easter feast. We give alms to identify with that great sacrifice of God giving His only begotten Son. With Easter on March 31 this year, I hope this finds that you had a very blessed celebration of this central Christian feast! Easter certainly brings thoughts of newness and renewal. We hope our fasting, praying and almsgiving renews our closeness to God.

As Spring settles in, I observe the many rituals of the season. I think of newness and renewal. Outside beds are prepared for new planting. I see the new blossoms on trees and flowers reaching full bloom, lengthening of daylight, and a rush of sounds and sights not seen for many months.
