FIRST CLASS RELIC OF ST JUDE THE APOSTLE AT SANTIAGO

On Monday April 29th, 2024 The first Class Relic of St. Jude The Apostle was brought to our parish by Fr. Carlos Martins, the founder and director of Treasures of The Church.

In 335, Constantine, the first Christian emperor, brought St. Jude's remains to Rome, when the Old St. Peter's Basilica was being built. St. Jude's remains, along with those of his missionary partner, Simon, were buried under that basilica, where they have remained until leaving Rome for the first time for this 100city tour of America, which began in September of 2023.

Promptly at 11:00AM, Mon April 29th a white cargo van pulling a trailer, driven by Fr. Carlos arrived at SDC. A group of Knights who had volunteered to help prepare the display greeted Fr. Carlos. Fr. Carlos opened the van and trailer then surveyed the parish grounds. He told us that he had very specific instructions on how to handle the materials we would be moving into the church and unpacking. Infused with much humor he gave us specific instructions on each crate was to be moved and unpacked. These crates ranged in size and

weight for 600lbs to 50lbs. It took us 3 hours to carefully unpack and set up everything as we were guided step by step by Fr. Carlos. It was truly an honor to be part of this but at the same time it was some very physically demanding work. So much so that Fr. Thomas approached us and reminded us that we were not 20-year-old young men and to please take a break to have some water and nourishment.

After all of the materials were properly set up Fr. Carlos lead the volunteers into the church and with only us

present put the relic of St. Jude's bone fragments from his right forearm into the display case. It was such a privilege to be part of this moment, words cannot express the gratitude and honor that I felt at this time.

From a little after 2 Pm until a Mass at 7PM the Relic was on display in our church for all who wanted to view and venerate it. Our Brother Honor Guards stayed with the relic the entire time; other Knights helped to direct the crowd of faithful people who came to participate in this special occasion. The faithful were directed to the pavilion and then a pathway was made from the pavilion to the church, and then inside the church up to the relic. Instructions were given on how to touch the display case, spend 10 seconds at the relic then exit the church or have a seat in the church if more time is desired to pray.

AT 7PM a Mass was said. The church was

People lined up in the Pavilion and beyond, well before the veneration began

filled to capacity and several more hundreds of people were outside by the church doors. Fr. Carlos Martins' homily included much information about St. Jude, the history of the relic, intercessions attributed to St. Jude, and suggestions on how to have a relationship with St. Jude. 24 hours later we are writing this article and still digesting all

that was said in the homily. The veneration continued after the Mass and lasted till 11:00 in the evening! The incredible number of the adoring crowd that passed through the relic counted 3,524 according to the e-count. The aged and infirm, the young and the old came to pass. Rosaries, prayer cards, and religious items touched to the encasement of the relic are now considered third class relics. May the intercession of St. Jude Thaddeus uplift our spirits to our Lord God.

The great success of the event can be attributed to the support of parishioners of Santiago and to Deacon Dan Diesel who was given the task to organize this once in a lifetime event.

The subcommittee under Jovie Kruki which included Asuncion Ortega, Ricardo Teano, Evelyn Santiago, and Shirley Burgos made all the difference in the handling of the 10 second face to face veneration of the religious relic to gain the plenary indulgence issued by the Holy See. To add to the solemnity of the occasion, 16 Knights of Columbus Color Corp Guards took 2 hour shifts to cover the 9 hours of exposure of the relic.

On a final note, St. Jude is mentioned only one time in the Bible. Yes, only one time, in from the Gospel of John;

"Whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

Judas, not the Iscariot, said to him, "Master, then what happened that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world?"

Jesus answered and said to him, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him."

At Monday's April 29th's daily Mass this was the Gospel reading for the day as set by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The same day our parish hosted the *Relic of St. Jude*!

Truly a day to remember.

SPRING - A TIME OF RENEWAL AND UPDATE

We spend six weeks each year during Lent fasting, praying and almsgiving. We hope to unite our fasting and praying with Jesus' 40 days of fasting and praying in the desert, to focus on preparing both our inner and outer selves to celebrate the great Easter feast. We give alms to identify with that great sacrifice of God giving His only begotten Son. With Easter on March 31 this year, I hope this finds that you had a very blessed celebration of this central Christian feast! Easter certainly brings thoughts of newness and renewal. We hope our fasting, praying and almsgiving renews our closeness to God.

As Spring settles in, I observe the many rituals of the season. I think of newness and renewal. Outside beds are prepared for new planting.
