GARDEN OF INNOCENCE MEMORIAL SERVICE

On June 1st, the officers of Council 9487 and our 4th degree Color Corps Guards participated in The Garden of Innocence Orange Memorial Services at El Toro Memorial Park Cemetery. Six victims of abortions were given names and a proper burial.

Babies Jackie, Tyler, William, Katherine, Ellen and Mary were laid to rest in a very moving and reverent service. Over 50 Knights of Columbus Color Guards, from various Assemblies, gave honors and led a procession through the cemetery to the grave sites in the Garden Of Innocence. Kathleen Kooiman, Chaplain for the Orange County Sheriff's Department, gave a brief talk in which she acknowledged the Knights of Columbus support of the Garden of Innocence, a non profit organization. Joseph Jorgensen from the San Clemente Church of Christ gave a talk on the gift of life. Our very own parishioner, Laura Garcia, gave a fitting homage and prayers to the 6 mothers of the baby angels.

A poem was recited for each of the deceased babies. The tiny coffins were laid in their final resting place where everyone at the ceremony lovingly spread rose petals in each of the graves. Doves were released representing all the babies who had previously been laid to rest in the Garden of Innocence, then six white doves were released, one at a time, for each of the six babies who were laid to rest at the memorial.

It was a very moving ceremony, and a theme was emphasized that stated ***"If No One Grieves, No One will Remember!"***

The Garden of Innocence is a very good act of charity that our council supports. May we never forget the victims of abortion.

We come from many places. And backgrounds. And stages in our lives. But we are all of one faith. A fraternity of men striving to better ourselves and our world.

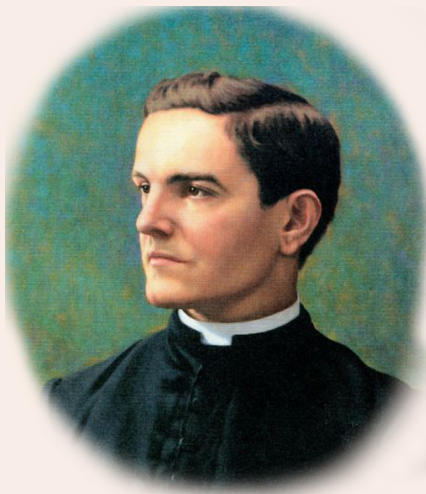

MAY 28 - BLOOD DRIVE RESULTS

We had another successful Blood Drive in May, thanks to all the generous volunteers, including several Knights.

Our goal was 38 units, and we collected 42, or 111% of goal.

We had 53 donors scheduled, 43 actually registered to donate, 5 donors were deferred, and we had 12 no-shows. We also had 8 first-time donors.

These results likely will impact more than 42 lives.

While I was doing sign ups at the church plaza, a parishioner came by to thank me for what we do, as he was a beneficiary of a transfusion that possibly saved his life.

Over the past 25 drives, we have collected 1007 units, an average of about 40 units per drive.

We have two more drives tentatively scheduled for this year August 20 and November 18, waiting for the church schedule to confirm those dates.
