The Knights afford him an opportunity to learn from other Catholic men on how to develop the self-discipline, integrity, and strength to do what is right and give others in our community a positive role model. Third, the Knights provide an organized opportunity for Nick to act out the virtue of charity. God calls on each of us to orient our will towards virtue. One the key virtues is charity. The Knights provide significant opportunities to serve God by giving towards others. For example, Nick joined in on Saturday clean ups at the church, served during the Fall Festival last year, worked several of the breakfast burritos on Sunday mornings, and marched in the 4th of July parade. Finally, He joined the Knights to create time and space where he can be with other men. Our culture is so focused on attempting to eliminate all spaces where men can spend time around other men. I believe it is incredibly valuable and important for men to intentionally create space and time where we can be just around other men. In that space, we can speak openly about issues that affect us as men. We can more easily learn from one another and strengthen each other. This opportunity is one of the unique benefits that the Knights offers.

Nick's has been married to his beautiful wife, Tara since 2019. They have three boys: Kayden is the oldest (5), and twins: Beckham $(3 \frac{1}{2})$ and Brooks $(3 \frac{1}{2})$. His wife was raised Catholic whereas Nick has recently converted to Catholicism after being raised Protestant by his mother and Orthodox by his father. He began seriously considering the Catholic faith after learning that many serious thinkers that he enjoy were Catholic. Once he began investigating what the Catholic faith was all about, he was convinced that Catholicism is true and he is still amazed at how beautiful our faith is. The Thomo's have been attending Santiago de Compostela since 2022.

Tara and Nick both work full time, criminal trial attorneys for the Orange County District Attorney. Tara works in the sexual assault unit focusing on rape and child molestation. Nick works in the homicide unit prosecuting homicides in Costa Mesa and Garden Grove, and jurisdictions covered by the Orange County Sheriff Department. Beyond his professional duties, he has participated in volunteer programs in the legal community such as CRF-OC, G.R.I.P. and high school mock trial.

CRF-OC is the local mock trial organization which allows high schoolers to demonstrate their skills in a real courtroom setting. Nick has served several times as a mock judge and juror for the program. G.R.I.P. is a program designed to prevent gangs from influencing and recruiting elementary school children. He has visited elementary schools through this program to educate teachers, students, and parents, about the dangers of gangs and how to help children avoid them. Nick also volunteers at a local public high school as a mock trial coach for Segerstrom High School in Santa Ana. He is currently employed at JSerra Catholic High School as an attorney mock trial coach for the Law Magnet Program.

Nick mentioned his boys are young but they are starting to get involved in athletics. He volunteered as a head coach for Friday Night Lights, a local flag football program and is currently enlisted to coach Kayden's team this fall. This past spring, Nick coached Kayden's tee ball team for the Lake Forest tee ball program.

The boys currently attend Mission Viejo Christian School. The twins are in preschool and Kayden is starting Kindergarten this fall. Tara and Nick are both registered to serve as volunteers in Kayden's kindergarten class and chaperones for their field trips.

As Nick continues to grow in our church community, he expects his leadership within the Knights to grow. He looks forward to continuing to deepen our friendship with one another and grow together as we serve our community and ultimately our God.
