Lyanamar was completing her bachelor's degree in Materials Engineering, while Leopoldo was a newly graduated engineer, when their paths crossed at Universidad Simon Bolivar. Not only did they share the same campus, but they also shared a deep passion for engineering.

Just a year after they met, Lyanamar and Leopoldo sealed their love in holy matrimony. Thirty-three years have passed since that day, and their marriage has been a testament to unwavering commitment, respect, faith, and above all, love. Together they have built a beautiful family with three children: Leopoldo (29), Luis David (26), and Fabiana (24). Their children have always been the center of their lives, bringing them together boundless joy and pride.

Twenty-two years ago, life presented a new chapter for the Pena-Medina family. They moved from Caracas to Puerto Rico, where new opportunities awaited them. In Puerto Rico, Lyanamar and Leopoldo immersed themselves in their community, advanced their careers, and nurtured their children. Lyanamar pursued further studies at the Institute of Theology and Pastoral Ministry in San Juan, which led her to serve as the Pastoral Coordinator at San Luis Rey Catholic School.

Fifteen years ago, their journey brought them

to California when Leopoldo's company transferred them here. They settled in Lake Forest and became dedicated members of the Santiago de Compostela Church Community. Their children completed their education at El Toro High School, with each following their dreams at prestigious universities across the country. After college they are now thriving in their respective careers. Leopoldo who was named to Forbes' 30 Under 30 list in 2023, and Luis are both company leaders in the technology space, while Fabiana is continuing her studies with the goal of entering the healthcare field.

All three of their children received their sacrament of Confirmation at Santiago de Compostela where Lyanamar and Leopoldo served in the Spanish Mass as Lectors. Their daughter Fabiana has followed in their footsteps, serving as a catechist assistant in both the English and Spanish Religious Education programs and volunteering as an adult leader for Vacation Bible School.

Lyanamar's dedication to Santiago de Compostela began in 2011 when she volunteered as a catechist for the new Catechesis Program in Spanish. The following year, the opportunity to coordinate the Religious Education (RE) program in Spanish arose. and she embraced the role. For the past twelve years, Lyanamar has been an integral part of the parish staff, starting as a part-time

employee and gradually taking on more responsibilities. She now holds a full-time position, coordinating both the Hispanic ministries and the Religious Education program in English & Spanish. Her commitment and leadership have helped grow these programs significantly, welcoming more families each year. Her ability to organize volunteers and plan events led Fr Thomas to appoint her as the Coordinator of the Annual Camino de Santiago, a role she has approached with passion and love since its inception eight years ago.

Beyond her official roles, Lyanamar is deeply involved in the spiritual life of the community. She helps plan special Masses, serves as a catechist for OCIA and Adult Confirmation, and is an Extraordinary Minister of the Holy Eucharist. Her dedication to serving others and fostering a strong, faith-filled community is evident in everything she does. Leopoldo, meanwhile, serves as the Global Director of Technical Support and Training for Alcon Labs. Despite his demanding career, he remains a steadfast support to Lyanamar, helping her carry out the many responsibilities she has at Santiago.

In their free time, Lyanamar and Leopoldo cherish being with their family, exploring new restaurants, playing with their dog Macchi, and enjoying the company of close friends.

For Lyanamar, Leopoldo and their children, being part of Santiago de Compostela community and having the privilege of serving the Lord through this parish family for over 13 years is a profound blessing that continues to inspire their faith and their lives.
