GARDEN OF INNOCENCE ORANGE - MEMORIAL SERVICE

On Saturday October 19th many of our brothers from council 9487, along with District Marshall Tom Arias and the Knights of Columbus Honor Guard, attended the Garden of Innocence Orange Memorial Service at El Toro Memorial Park.

"If no one grieves, no one will remember!" is the motto of the Garden of Innocence organization. The Garden of Innocence, inc. is a non profit 501(c)(3) organization located in Carlsbad, CA. Their mission is to undertake the expenses of a dignified burial to unidentified and abandoned babies throughout our area. This is their 25th year of providing this service.

This past October 19th, 6 abandoned babies were named and given a proper burial. They are babies: Delilah, Juanita, Grant, Mark, Don and Ken. PGK Dave Atkins and his wife Marti named Baby Ken and Brother Steve Seastrom and his wife Sue named Baby Don.

A bagpipe player, Tress Maksimuk, led a procession followed by around 60 Knights of Columbus Honor Guard members to the burial site.



Reverend Jerry Moore presented the children's message. His theme was that this service was a celebration of life and joy. He asked us to picture the children playing, running and joyfully laughing in the presence of God. Thinking and praying for the children in this joyful context was a wonderful way to process this experience!

Six poems, one written for each child, was recited by each author. The babies were placed in their graves and each attendee was given the opportunity to place rose petals in the six graves. A dove was released for each of the 6 babies and then a group of doves was released in remembrance of the burials of past abandoned babies. The Knights of Columbus Honor Guard then retired from the gravesites.

Some concluding thoughts were said by members of the Garden of Innocence organization along with anyone who wished to share some words. It was such a moving experience to attend this memorial. I am sure each person who attended the service felt grateful to be a part of the memorial. There was a very gentle breeze flowing during the service and I could not help but feel that this was a gift from the Holy Spirit letting us know of his presence.

I went with my sister and brother-in-law, some relatives, and some friends of my sister and brother in law. About 30 of us in total. Of course I am wearing my KoC hat and one of the guys in our group tells me he is a Knight and then we discover we went to the same high school. He tells me what year he graduated and it is the same year as my older brother who passed away in 2006. Not only was he my brother's classmate but they were pretty good friends. It was such a blessing to talk to someone who had known my brother so well. This was the second impact the hat had on me during this trip.

It was quite a feeling of brotherhood from total strangers.

Another reason for my trip was to visit childhood and college friends. I had lunch with 2 friends that I had known all through grade school and high school. I texted a picture of the 3 of us to another childhood friend who now lives in Tennessee. He called me immediately after getting the text and said I want to talk to you. He tells me he still has faith but does not attend church anymore. He said my facebook postings about my activities with the Knights has got him
